Dear Ms. Corley:

On April 23, 2001, and May 21, 2001, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee and its treasurer, and the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee and its treasurer, respectively, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

On June 10, 2003, the Commission, found, on the basis of the information in the complaint, and information provided by you, that there is no reason to believe the Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee and Andrew Grossman, as treasurer, and the Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee and James J. Bonham, as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. § 441b(a). Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter as it pertains to them.


The Commission reminds you that the confidentiality provisions of 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(12)(A) remain in effect, and that this matter is still open with respect to other respondents. The Commission will notify you when the entire file has been closed, at which time you will be sent a copy of the dispositive General Counsel's Report.
