

**CONSENT TO EXTEND THE TIME  
TO INSTITUTE A CIVIL LAW ENFORCEMENT SUIT**

As consideration for the Federal Election Commission's agreement to extend the period for post-probable cause conciliation discussions in this matter, Respondent Kentucky State District Council of Carpenters, now known as the Indiana-Kentucky Regional Council of Carpenters, hereby consents to toll the statute of limitations for any civil enforcement action that the Federal Election Commission might institute in connection with MUR 5268 pursuant to 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(6) from June 24, 2004 through July 24, 2004.
