
On October 15, 2002, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, Torricelli for U.S. Senate, Inc. and Timothy Sean Jackson, as treasurer, of a complaint alleging violations of regulations pertaining to the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. On February 12, 2004, the Commission found, on the basis of the information in the complaint and information provided by your clients, that there is no reason to believe Torricelli for U.S. Senate, Inc. and Timothy Sean Jackson, as treasurer, violated 11 C.F.R. §§ 102.9(e) or 110.1(b)(3)(i)(C). Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Statement of Policy Regarding Disclosure of Closed Enforcement and Related Files, 68 Fed. Reg. 70,426 (Dec. 18, 2003). A copy of the General Counsel's Report is enclosed for your information.
