
On June 21, 2004, the Federal Election Commission reviewed the allegations in your complaint filed November 19, 2002, and found that on the basis of the information provided in your complaint, the responses to the complaint, other information provided by the Respondents, and the information available to the public, there is no reason to believe Space Gateway Support, LLC and Sean O'Keefe violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. In addition, the Commission exercised its prosecutorial discretion and dismissed the complaint with respect to Yang Enterprises, Inc., Tom Feeney for Congress and Nancy H. Watkins, as treasurer. Accordingly, the Commission closed the file in MUR 5336 on June 21, 2004.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Statement of Policy Regarding Disclosure of Closed Enforcement and Related Files, 68 Fed. Reg. 70,426 (Dec. 18, 2003). A copy of the dispositive General Counsel's Report is enclosed for your information.

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. See 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(8).
