Re: Complaint and Request for Investigation Into Use of County Political Committee As Straw Donor for Congressional Candidate's Campaign By Magla Products, LLC and its President Jordan Glatt

Dear Counsel:

Please be advised that the Summit City Republican Committee at Post Office Box 572, Summit, New Jersey 07901, files this complaint, pursuant to the Federal Election Campaign Act (hereinafter referred to as the "Act"), as amended at 2 *U.S.C.A.* § 437g(a)(1) and Federal Election Commission (hereinafter referred to as "Commission") regulations, 11 *C.F.R.* § 111.4, with respect to contributions made in October 2002 by Magla Products, LLC, a registered New Jersey corporation with its principal offices located at 159 South Street, Morristown, New Jersey made by and through its President, Jordan Glatt, who resides at 141 Oak Ridge Road, Summit New Jersey to the Union County Democratic Committee for the explicit purpose of aiding the campaign of Timothy Carden for the United States Congress in the Seventh Congressional District of New Jersey. Based on the facts presented herein, we are confident that the Commission will want to investigate this matter in the interests of enforcing blatant violations of the Act and Commission regulations.

Based on public information contained in reports filed with the Commission and the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("ELEC") during the 2002 general election and written statements made by Jordan Glatt and Bryan Burrough in the *Summit Independent Press*, and upon information and belief, we believe that a simple investigation by the Commission will reveal that: (1) Jordan Glatt exceeded contribution limits pursuant to the Act and Commission regulations, 11 *C.F.R.* § 110.1(b)(2002), when his company, Magla Products, LLC, contributed

\$15,000 to the Union County Democratic Committee for the purpose of serving as a straw donor and/or expending funds on behalf of Timothy Carden via the Carden for Congress Committee; (2) Magla Products, LLC, as a duly registered New Jersey Limited Liability Corporation, is in violation of the Act and Commission regulations with respect to making an illegal corporate contribution based on its non-partnership filing status under the Internal Revenue Code and regulations in violation of 11 *C.F.R.* § 114.2 (2002), or in the alternative, for its failure to attribute said contributions to its partners within the allowable limits pursuant to the Act and Commission regulations under 11 *C.F.R.* § 110.1(g) (2002); and (3) Glatt also violated the Act and Commission regulations, 11 *C.F.R.* § 110.1(b)(2002) by making a \$5,000 contribution on September 11, 2002 to the New Jersey Democratic State Committee; which thereafter, was passed onto the Carden for Congress Committee on October 19, 2002 as a "Party Coordinated Expenditure."

Commission reports display two \$1,000 contributions from Jordan Glatt on February 31, 2002 and April 8, 2002 to the Carden for Congress Committee (Exhibit 1). The total amount of \$2,000 would meet the allowable limits as imposed by the Act and Commission regulations for the 2002 primary and general elections respectively. Obviously, these contributions are legal so long as properly designated.

Nevertheless, upon review of the New Jersey ELEC reports, Jordan Glatt made contributions totalling \$15,600 immediately before the general election for U.S. Congress between October 7, 2002 and October 24, 2002. (Exhibit 2). Based on the Union County Democratic Committee's quarterly report filed with ELEC January 15, 2003, the Union County Democrats expended all or a portion of these funds on the behalf of the Carden for Congress Committee during the same time period, that may include, but is not limited to the following expenditures:

- (1) October 8, 2002 to Message and Media, located on 65 Church Street, New Brunswick, New Jersey, production mailer GUC-02-101, in the amount of \$15,300 (check #3224).
- (2) October 8, 2002 to Message and Media, located on 65 Church Street, New Brunswick, New Jersey, production mailer GUC-02-1S01, in the amount of \$11,420 (check #3225).
- (3) October 8, 2002 to Message and Media, located on 65 Church Street, New Brunswick, New Jersey, production mailer GUC-02-D01, in the amount of \$18,155 (check #3226).
- (4) October 9, 2002 to Message and Media, located on 65 Church Street, New Brunswick, New Jersey, production mailer GUC-02-P01, in the amount of \$22,000 (check #3229).
- (5) October 10, 2002 to Postmaster located on North Broad Street, Elizabeth, postage, GUC-02-P01, in the amount of \$15,890.

(6) November 5, 2002 to Carden for Congress, in the amount of \$750 (check #3369).

Additionally, the Commission should also look into Glatt's \$5,000 contribution on September 11, 2002 to the New Jersey Democratic State Committee that was passed onto the Carden for Congress Committee on October 19, 2002 as a "Party Coordinated Expenditure" specifically for a poll conducted by Beneson Strategy Group. (Exhibit 3a-c)

Our belief that the Union County Democratic Committee was used as a straw donor to circumvent federal contribution limits—although initially difficult to prove—has now been admitted by Mr. Glatt himself as follows:

Republicans are criticizing the Democratic candidate for mayor, Jordan Glatt, for political contributions he made to the state and Union County Democratic committees. . . . In the final weeks Mr. Glatt explained his contributions to a 2002 Congressional campaign was to support a friend, Tim Carden. . . .

Moreover, not only has Mr. Glatt made this surprising admission to using the Union County Democratic Committee as a straw donor to Carden's campaign, but one of his volunteers has confirmed it in a recent letter to the editor that he was personally told by Jordan Glatt the following:

-- Jordan did tell me he wanted to set the record straight on one point. Someone in John's camp unearthed the not-so-startling fact that Jordan had contributed money to a Union County political committee. Jordan made contributions earmarked for his friend Tim Carden, who was running for Congress at the time.

Upon the drafting of this complaint, another surprising admission has been dispatched by Mr. Glatt's Campaign Chairperson, Terry Turko, via an electronic mail message dispatched to campaign volunteers on October 23, 2003, which states in pertinent part that "Jordan's only contributions to the County Democrats were for a friend who was running for Assembly and lost." (Exhibit 5). Apparently, Ms. Turko is confused about whom Mr. Glatt was supporting, but it further demonstrates Glatt's pattern of using the Union County Democratic Committee to launder money to the Carden for Congress Committee.

Glatt Statement in the Independent Press

Issue of campaign contributions surfaces

SUMMIT - In the final weeks before the Nov. 4 election, Republicans are criticizing the Democratic candidate for mayor, Jordan Glatt, for political contributions he made to the state and Union County Democratic committees.

A statement issued by the Summit Republican City Committee makes the point that Mr. Glatt backed Democrats who supported the re-activation of the Rahway Valley rail line, a move opposed by Common Council and numerous city residents.

John Maher, the Republican candidate for mayor, raised the issue at League of Women Voters debate on Wednesday, Oct. 15.

Mr. Glatt said he refused to respond to the accusation during the debate, saying the election was too important to use such tactics.

In a telephone interview later, Mr. Maher said, "I think the voters deserve an explanation. He seems to be saying one thing locally and an-

other at the county at state level."

Mr. Maher said Mr. Glatt, through his contributions, essentially supports high state and county taxes, Governor James E. McGreevey's cuts in education and the Union County freeholders' action to re-activate the Rahway Valley Railroad. He said some of Mr. Glatt's contributions were made after the county entered an agreement with the state to re-activate the line.

"I would rather talk about issues," Mr. Maher said. "But it does raise a question about Jordan's inconsistency, saying one thing at the local level while funneling funds to Democrats at county and state levels."

In a telephone interview, Mr. Glatt said, "I am incredulous that John Maher would stoop to that." Both mayoral candidates are current members of Summit's Common Council.

Mr. Glatt explained his contribution to a 2002 Congressional campaign was to support a friend, Tim Carden, formerly of Summit, who

was running against the GOP's Michael Ferguson. He is shocked, Mr. Glatt said, that Summit's Republican Party would go to such lengths to look into his personal finances.

"I often make campaign contributions to friends," he said. In June, 2003, he contributed \$2,200 to senate candidate Blair MacInnes, he said, who serves with him on the Board of Trustees at Drew University in Madison. Mr. Glatt pointed out that he contributed an equal amount to the campaign of current Summit Mayor Walter Long, who is a Republican.

"The Republicans are trying to link this up to the situation with the Rahway Valley Railroad," he said, "but that issue didn't come up until about six months ago. If John Maher knew about the plan to re-activate the train sooner, why didn't he speak up?"

According to the statement by the GOP City Committee, Mr. Glatt and his company, Magla Products, contributed a total of \$23,800 to De-

ocrats, including \$15,600 to the Union County Democratic Committee, in October 2002.

The freeholders had signed a contract three months earlier, in July 2002, with the Morris and Essex Railroad to reactivate the former Rahway Valley right-of-way. But in October 2002, the freeholders were still saying publicly that they had made no commitment to reactivate the railway.

Mr. Glatt emphasized that he is not happy with the way the Board of Chosen Freeholders handled the railroad situation, by not informing constituents of its agreement with the state and the M&E.

Summit GOP spokesman Michael Vernotico said in the written statement issued by the Republican City Committee, "Throughout this campaign, Jordan Glatt has attempted to divert himself from the McGreevey organization. However, \$23,800 in campaign contributions proves he is a strong supporter of Jim McGreevey and his tax and spend policies."

Mr. Glatt has suggested that local Republicans are not without fault in the lack of public information surrounding the reactivation of the Rahway Valley Railroad.

'Supporting Summit?'

At an Oct. 7 Common Council meeting, Mr. Glatt questioned the presence of former Summit Mayor Frank Lehr and East Summit resident Rosemary Barreca on the Union County Transportation Advisory Board. "Shouldn't they be supporting Summit?" he asked at the council meeting.

Council President Cindy Martin said she has spoken with Summit's representatives and did not want to get into personality issues.

Mr. Glatt told the Independent Press, "If those were Democrats on the transportation board, the Republicans would be screaming to get them off."

The representatives to that board are appointed by Common Council, he said.

Should one family hold two elected offices?

To the editor

There is a factor in the upcoming Madison Borough Council election that troubles me, and that I think needs to be a major consideration for voters

Democratic candidate John Elias' wife Melissa is a member of the Madison Board of Education. This creates an unavoidable conflict-of-interest situation any time the two bodies of elected officials must deal with an issue that affects both the school district and the borough. Also, if a school budget is turned down by the voters, it is Borough Council that must make the final determination as to what amount to approve.

Of course, Mr Elias could recuse himself in any such situation. But why elect someone when there is the potential for him to have to do so repeatedly? (In fact, due to his conflict he already had to decline answering a question at last Monday's Candidates' Forum.)

Likewise, Mrs. Elias would have no choice but to recuse herself from any Board of Education issues that involved dealings with the borough, with the result being that both governing bodies would be impaired.

I have no reason to believe that Mr. and Mrs. Elias aren't fine people with good intentions, but even putting the conflict issue aside, only 11 people in Madison — six on the Borough Council and five on the Board of Education — vote on what we pay in property taxes every year. For two of those votes to come from one household, especially when there is a field of good council candidates to choose from, is simply wrong.

Election 2003: Endorsement Caliber of candidates

The Independent Press does not routinely endorse political candidates because routine candidates don't deserve to be endorsed.

At times the Independent Press has even declined to endorse superior candidates. The most frequent reason — in our often one-party towns — is because it served no purpose to endorse the front runner coming down the homestretch to finish as the odds-on favorite. An endorsement under those conditions just rules on the long-shot second

And yet there is a group of candidates who have community, and have on local issues.
