RE: I am filing this COMPLAINT.

Dear Sir/Madam:

I am angry about a fraudulent solicitation. The facts are as follows:

FACTS:

On October 23, 2001, I received a call on my call notes from a woman identifying herself as Jeanette Hoffman. She left a message that she was with the office of Congressman Tom Davis in Washington. His office wanted me to serve as the "honorary chairman of a new business advisory council". The return number was _____ I did not return that call.

On December 5, 2001, I received another call from a Pat Scott who claimed to be from the same organization. The return number was the same.

On December 12, 2001, I received another call from the same organization. I did take this call and personally talked with a woman who identified herself as Tonya Bradley. She told me that she was an aid to a Congressman Hoffman. She said that the president needed for me to serve on a high level business advisory council. She repeatedly asked me if the president could count on my support. I asked her to specify what "support" meant. She said it meant going to Washington for these counsel meetings. Eventually she then asked me to donate to "The National Republican Congressional Committee". I cannot remember the exact figure she requested, but I think it was \$1,500. When I said I could not, she asked me if I could just send \$150 to 300.

I then asked her how a congressional aid could solicit funds for the Republican Party during business hours. She gave me no answer and asked me if I would like to speak to her supervisor. Then a man identifying himself as Jerry Vineyard talked to me. He then informed me that neither of them were aids to the congressman. He said he worked for Infocision, a telemarketing firm in Huntington, West Virginia. When I told him that it was fraudulent to have his employees identify themselves as congressional aids, he said I was "splitting hairs".

ISSUES:


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This needs to be investigated. I would like to know if this solicitation was done with Congressman Davis' knowledge? Were these telemarketers in fact aids to Congressman Davis and working on a campaign on government time? If these women did work for Infocision, I cannot believe that our election laws allow fundraisers to lie about who they are and who they represent in order to get me to talk with them. My paralegals would have screened this call if Ms. Bradley had not identified herself as a congressional aid.
