

Dear Attorney Tran,

In regards to the Matter Under Review, I was never coerced, forced or intimidated to make a contribution to Virgil Goode by Mitchell Wade or any employee of MZM. The only conversation I had with Mr. Wade concerning my contribution occurred approximately the middle to end of February 2005. During a routine office visit, after discussing work issues, I informed Mr. Wade that I would contribute to the MZM Political Action Committee at the end of the month. Mr. Wade asked me if I would contribute to the Goode campaign in lieu of the Political Action Committee. I said I would. In the course of our discussion I also stated I thought my wife would also contribute. It had previously been announced at an MZM staff meeting that donations or contributions for Virgil Goode were being collected. I did not feel that I was being forced or mandated to contribute, nor did I feel that detrimental action would be taken against me if I did not. I did believe it was in the best interest of the company to contribute, as Mr. Goode supported the work being done at the Martinsville MZM office. I did not have any other conversations, discussions or correspondence on the subject of any contributions with Mr. Wade.
