Dear Sir or Madam:

A recent review of both federal and state (solicitor district) campaign committee filings made on behalf of the candidate, Harold W. Gowdy, III (aka Trey Gowdy) for each office raises concern about the appropriate use of monies from his state campaign committee for use in the current federal election cycle.

In this regard, the following timeline and specific items need to be considered:

1. Trey Gowdy files Statement of Candidacy FEC Form 2 (*undated*) for the U.S. Congress on May 27, 2009, according to postmark recorded by the FEC Mail Center.
2. Trey Gowdy, through the act of his designated Treasurer, Marvin Quattlebaum, files a Statement of Organization FEC Form 1 (dated May 26, 2009) establishing the "Trey Gowdy for Congress" federal campaign committee.
3. Trey Gowdy publicly announces his candidacy for the U.S. Congress on June 1, 2009, per numerous media accounts.
4. Trey Gowdy receives his first itemized campaign contribution on May 26, 2009.
5. Trey Gowdy, through the act of his Treasurer, files his first federal campaign committee report at the end of the 2nd Quarter of 2009 referencing receipts and expenditures for the period April 1 through June 30, 2009.
 - A) Receipts (contributions) of \$87,924.00
 - B) Expenditures of \$4,924.52 which consisted of only three (3) items (see Attachment 1):

- i. Direct mail processing of \$424.10 on June 30, 2009.
 - ii. Printing expense of \$412.34 on June 30, 2009.
 - iii. Website Development of \$3,806.00 on June 29, 2009, from a firm "Under The Power Lines" (aka UTPL).
- 6. Trey Gowdy also files a state-authorized campaign unsubmitted report with the SC State Ethics Commission for his re-election campaign as 7th District Solicitor in 2012 on July 1, 2009, referencing receipts and expenditures for the period April 1 through June 30, 2009.
 - A) Receipts (contributions) of \$0.00.
 - B) Expenditures of \$6,793.79 which included the following items (see Attachment 2):
 - i. Solicitor Website Design & Development of \$6,000.00 on April 9, 2009, from the firm "UTPL" (same firm as mentioned above).
 - ii. US Postmaster (postal service) of \$112.00 on May 19, 2009.
 - iii. Reimbursements to Spartanburg County for "office related expenses and supplies" in the amounts of \$188.62 on May 20, 2009, and \$166.37 on June 19, 2009.
- 7. Trey Gowdy continues to file state-authorized campaign committee reports with the SC State Ethics Commission for his re-election campaign as 7th District Solicitor in 2012 through the end of 2009, containing more reimbursements for office expenses, supplies and phone bills (see Attachment 3) which are conspicuously absent from subsequent federal campaign committee reports for the 3rd and 4th Quarters of 2009.

Based on the above timeline and specific publicly reported items, common sense and a knowledge of campaign committee and vendor workings suggest that it is likely that the Trey Gowdy for Congress Committee (C00462523) has violated federal election laws by utilizing state-authorized campaign committee funds for use in a forthcoming federal election and not disclosing all relevant expenditures as required by law. It certainly warrants further investigation.

Relevant questions would include:


- 1. How is it possible to raise \$87,924 for a federal campaign without spending any monies for office expenses such as but not necessarily limited to postage, telephone and/or cellular fees?

Campaigns run on cellular phones! Busy politicians rely on them! And no thank you notes were sent requiring postage and stationary of some type?

2. What do all relevant phone bills (home, work, campaign, cellular) show regarding fundraising efforts to raise that \$87,924 during the 2nd Quarter of 2009? Calls had to have been made and, if so, from what devices? This information should be easy enough to obtain.
3. How is it possible that a solicitor's campaign website cost more (\$6,000) than a congressional campaign website (\$3,806)? It is not! In fact, congressional websites usually cost more than both these amounts combined. And, furthermore, where is the solicitor's campaign website that cost \$6,000?

Under penalty of perjury, I believe the information stated in this Complaint to be true and submit this Complaint for your immediate consideration, deliberation and final determination.

Campaign Practices Law and Penalties

I. Section 8-13-1300, et al.

SECTION 8-13-765. Use of government personnel or facilities for campaign purposes; government personnel permitted to work on campaigns on own time.

(A) No person may use government personnel, equipment, materials, or an office building in an election campaign. The provisions of this subsection do not apply to a public official's use of an official residence.

(B) A government, however, may rent or provide public facilities for political meetings and other campaign-related purposes if they are available on similar terms to all candidates and committees, as defined in Section 8-13-1300(6).

(C) This section does not prohibit government personnel, where not otherwise prohibited, from participating in election campaigns on their own time and on nongovernment premises.

SECTION 8-13-1846. Use of public funds, property, or time to influence election; prohibition; exceptions.

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(A) A person may not use or authorize the use of public funds, property, or time to influence the outcome of an election.

(B) This section does not prohibit the incidental use of time and materials for preparation of a newsletter regarding activities of the body of which a public official is a member.

(C) This section does not prohibit the expenditure of public resources by a governmental entity to prepare informational materials, conduct public meetings, or respond to news media or citizens' inquiries concerning a ballot measure affecting that governmental entity; however, a governmental entity may not use public funds, property, or time in an attempt to influence the outcome of a ballot measure.

SECTION 8-13-1350. Prohibition of use of funds for campaign for one office to further candidacy of same person for different office.

(A) A candidate for elective office may use or permit the use of contributions solicited for or received by the candidate for that office to further the candidacy of the individual for a different office as long as the contributions have been received on or before December 31, 1992, and have been transferred to a campaign account for the different office on or before December 31, 1992. A contribution solicited for or received on behalf of the candidate is considered solicited or received for the candidacy for which the individual is then a candidate if the funds or contributions are solicited or received before the general election for which the candidate is a nominee or is unopposed. The prohibition on the use or solicitation of funds does not limit in any way a candidate from retaining funds for use in a subsequent race for the same elective office.

(B) Any assets or funds which are:

- (1) the proceeds of a campaign contribution which are held by or under the control of a public official or a candidate for public office on January 1, 1993; and
- (2) which continue to be held by or under the control of a public official or a candidate for public office on January 1, 1993; are subject to the provisions of subsection (A).

SECTION 8-13-1351. Exemption to prohibition of use of funds for campaign for one office to further candidacy of same person for different office.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 8-13-1350, a candidate may use or permit the use of contributions solicited for or received by the candidate to further the candidacy of the individual for an elective office other than the elective office for which the contributions were received if:

- (1) the person originally making the contribution gives written authorization for its use to further the candidacy of the individual for a specific office which is not the office for which the contribution was originally intended; and

- (2) the contribution is otherwise permitted by law.
