Dear Mr. Torchinsky:

On June 8, 2011, your client was notified that the Federal Election Commission found reason to believe that Aristotle International, Inc. violated 52 U.S.C. § 30111(a)(4) (then 2 U.S.C. § 438(a)(4)) of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. On April 9, 2019, the Commission considered the General Counsel's and Aristotle's briefs but was equally divided over whether to find probable cause to believe that Aristotle violated 52 U.S.C. § 30111(a)(4). Accordingly, the Commission closed the file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons explaining the basis for the Commission's decision will follow.
