Re: MUIR 6341- Request to Dismiss Suspicious Contributions Complaint

Dear Ms. Collins:

I respectfully request that the Federal Election Commission dismiss the suspicious contributions complaint filed under MUIR 6341. This request is made for the following reasons.

The main focus of this complaint is in regard to the individual contributions to my 2010 2nd Quarterly report, of \$50,665.00, the bulk of which was labeled as a loan to my campaign, by me. As the complaint states, I have loaned money to my campaign in each of the last three election cycles. The amounts have varied, but I, as many other local, state and national candidates have made loans to our own campaigns. In a national race \$50,000.00 is not a lot of money.

The complainant makes many statements of half truths and lies, in this complaint, starting with, "having been in the architectural field for about 15 years," the complainant is not an architect. She only worked in an architectural office. That no more makes her an authority on the field of architecture than working in a hospital makes you a doctor. The dramatic fluctuations in the field are both up and down, or else they wouldn't be called fluctuations.

The complainant states, "As an American caring about the future of this country being in the hands of those in and out of government honorable in their behavior, motivation, deeds, I have looked carefully and in detail at all candidates in the forthcoming elections by doing due diligence as to their backgrounds, claims, history, etc." According to the Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections the complainant would have had to look carefully and in detail at over 32 candidates in the August Republican Primary Election. Based on the dates in this document the complainant worked on this complaint for over three months.

The complainant is a volunteer for Mike Prendergast, one of my opponents in the U.S. Congress 11th District of Florida Republican Primary race. This was their affect to engage in negative campaigning.

At the end of all my campaigns the only entity not paid off completely was myself. I have never borrowed money for my campaigns we only spent what we had. Many candidates have self-funded their campaigns. My primary financial resources have always been the money from my small business, which this year has done well, the income of my wife (Sylvia L. Adams) and some of the resources of my father (Eddie Adams, Sr.). My father's estate is valued at over one million dollars.

This year has been better than most in Residential Design for me, I have a small office, but I do most of my work at home. Some years I have had ten clients and other years I will have fifty clients. I mainly do home renovations, bedrooms and bathroom additions. Because the market for buying and selling is so bad more people are fixing and renovating what they have, which is good for me.



As part of my reply to this complaint I have attached a letter from my bank stating that in my personal accounts I have over \$100,000.00. I think the big question here was could I afford to loan my campaign \$50,665.00. The answer is yes I could. With that being said please receive my Request to Dismiss Suspicious Contributions Complaint.
