Re: Complaint – Jane Norton, Josh Penry, The U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

Dear Mrs. Duncan,

Pursuant to federal statute and federal election commission regulations please accept this as complaint against Jane Norton, Josh Penry, and the U.S. Chamber of Commerce ("U.S. Chamber"). This complaint is seeking an investigation and enforcement action relating to alleged violations of Federal Election Campaign Laws. The actions of Jane Norton, Josh Penry and the U.S. Chamber violated federal election laws including provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act, 2 U.S.C. § 431 *et seq.* and corresponding regulations. The previous individuals and entities will hereby referred to as the "Respondents." The Respondents have individually and collectively violated the prohibition on accepting uncoordinated communications paid for by individuals and/or corporations and violated federal statute by making a direct corporate contribution to a U.S. Senate candidate. The Federal Election Commission ("FEC") has jurisdiction to investigate and enforce these regulations.

#### FACTS

1. Jane Norton ("Norton") was a candidate running for the nomination of the Republican Party for a U.S. Senate seat from Colorado.
2. Bill Miller is the Senior Vice President of the U.S. Chamber. The U.S. Chamber endorsed Norton on June 28, 2010. This endorsement was made by the U.S. Chamber's Bill Miller.
3. On June 28, 2010 Bill Miller joined Jane Norton and her campaign manager Josh Penry announcing the endorsement on a telephone conference call.
4. It is believed that Bill Miller in his role as Senior Vice President of the U.S. Chamber knew the personal political plan of Mrs. Norton.

5. On or about July 30, 2010, the U.S. Chamber disbursed \$250,000 to an ad agency for the creation of a television advertisement. This advertisement was entitled "Rock Ribbed Conservative" and was a pro-Norton advertisement that mentions the Norton campaign.

6. Bill Miller was a Person Sharing/Exercising Control as listed on the FEC Form 9 filing.

7. The U.S. Chamber of Commerce did not list contributors on the FEC Form 9.

8. It is believed through public information and knowledgeable sources that Josh Penry and Bill Miller coordinated with Charlie and Judy Black to raise the money for the independent expenditure.

9. Judy Black a representative of the Jane Norton campaign also works for a lobbying firm that works for the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

#### **ALLEGATIONS**

10. FEC regulations prohibit corporations from coordinating issue advocacy efforts with federal campaigns. In this case, the U.S. Chamber launched the television advertisement after meeting with Jane Norton and her staff and consulting team as well as after formally endorsing Norton. This is a per se violation of the anti-coordination provisions of the FEC rules and regulations.

11. Individuals who exercise control over a specific issue advocacy campaign must not communicate or coordinate with a campaign mentioned in an advertisement. Bill Miller was listed on the FEC Form 9 filing as a Person Sharing/Exercising Control. However, Bill Miller had earlier communicated via Twitter (a type of on-line message board) and in person his support and endorsement of Norton. Mr. Miller as a representative of the Chamber had also met

with Jane Norton and her campaign team to discuss campaign strategy. This is an impermissible communication under FEC rules and regulations.

WHEREFORE, the complainant asks that the Federal Election Commission investigate the actions of the U.S. Chamber and enforce the relevant provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Laws and FEC Regulations.

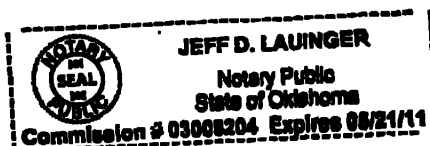

**U.S. Chamber backs Norton**By ALLISON SHERRY |  3 Comments

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce backed GOP Senate hopeful Jane Norton today, saying she has a record of "supporting the state's businesses and workers."

Though Norton has little business experience — much of her career has been spent in government appointments — U.S. Chamber Vice President Bill Miller said she has a "record of standing up for the people of Colorado in these challenging economic times."

The Chamber endorsement comes at a time Norton is trailing her primary opponent, Weld County District Attorney Ken Buck, in polls [1].

Buck has also been greatly helped by the Americans for Jobs Security, an outside political group that doesn't have to disclose donor lists, with television ads across the state.

Norton's campaign said Monday it has no knowledge of money help coming her direction from the endorsement. It is illegal for campaigns to coordinate with outside political groups, like so-called 527s.

In a summertime call to reporters, Norton said she had experience bringing economic development to Colorado leading the Colorado Space Coalition. And she takes credit for locating to Denver the Lockheed Martin/Boeing partnership of the United Launch Alliance.

"I have a record of working with business development," she said to reporters.

Buck's campaign denied the endorsement, saying it was just one more example of her winning over the hearts of the GOP establishment.

"I guess if all it took was a blue chip establishment endorsement that have been part of her campaign since day one, Jane Norton would be running ahead in the polls instead of behind," said Walt Klein, Buck's campaign manager.

### Chamber Backs Norton in Colorado

The United States Chamber of Commerce is backing Jane Norton for Senate in Colorado, an establishment endorsement for a Republican candidate trying to fend off an opponent that seems to have more conservative grassroots appeal.

In a statement released today, Bill Miller, the Chamber's political director, said Ms. Norton "has a record of standing up for the people of Colorado in these challenging economic times."

"On issues ranging from competition in the health care industry, to lowering taxes, to reducing energy costs, Colorado's businesses and workers will have a tireless advocate in Jane Norton," Mr. Miller added.

The Chamber endorsement comes just days after Senator John Cornyn, the chairman of the National Republican Senatorial Committee, attended a fundraiser with Ms. Norton, a former lieutenant governor. Ms. Norton faces Ken Buck in an August primary, which is shaping up to be among the more exciting nominating contests left this midterm cycle.

Mr. Buck, the Weld County district attorney, has gained a significant following among Tea Party activists and won by far the most support at a May party assembly that Ms. Norton skipped, deciding instead to gather signatures and petition her way into the primary.

Ms. Norton, meanwhile, is trying to avoid the fate of Senate candidates like Trey Grayson and Sam Lowden, Republicans with the establishment stamp of approval who were unable to capture the party's nomination. (The Chamber, for example, also backed Mr. Grayson during his primary battle in Kentucky with Rand Paul.)

Earlier this month, Ms. Norton went up with a television advertisement that sounded concerns voiced by many within the Tea Party movement, such as the size of the national debt. Her campaign has also announced that, starting Tuesday, she will embark on a four-day "Repeal Obamacare Tour."

And, as Politico just noted, Mr. Buck may still face some heat for certain views that could be seen as outside the mainstream, including calling Social Security horrible policy.

## Chamber comes to Norton's aid

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce backed former Colorado Lt. Gov. Jane Norton's campaign for Senate Monday, giving the flagging establishment favorite a potentially valuable endorsement as she faces down a primary challenge from insurgent conservative Ken Buck.

Citing Norton's work on health care and economic development issues under Gov. Bill Owens, Chamber of Commerce president Tom Donohue called her a fierce advocate for "attacking spending and improving job creation."

Pressed by reporters on a conference call, Donohue acknowledged that the Chamber picked Norton as its preferred candidate against Democratic Sen. Michael Bennet largely due to questions of electability.

"What we're looking for is a horse — excuse me Jane — that can run in the big race. There are a lot of good people," he said. "What we're doing is saying, who has the best chance of winning?" he said.

An automated SurveyUSA poll released last week showed Norton trailing Buck, the Weld County district attorney, by double digits in the GOP nomination fight. Donohue dismissed the impact of that poll in the group's decision-making.

"There are polls all over the place. I've got polls that are showing her up and showing her down. We don't run our business on polls," he said. "This is not a vote against somebody. This is an endorsement of somebody."

He declined to say exactly how the Chamber would assist Norton ahead of the Aug. 10 primary, but said: "We think the timing's important to do this right now."

Donohue's group has already faced several setbacks this election cycle. Though the business advocate claimed the Chamber wins 80 percent of the races it gets involved in, it's seen two major Senate primary losses: in Kentucky, where the group backed Secretary of State Trey Grayson over Rand Paul, and in Utah, where it lined up behind business consultant Tim Bridgewater instead of attorney Mike Lee.

On the same call, Norton took a swipe at one of Buck's most prominent backers: South Carolina Sen. Jim DeMint, who also endorsed Paul and several other insurgent Republican primary candidates.

"DeMint lost more of his fair share," she said, reminding listeners that the senator's favored candidate in the California Senate race, Chuck DeMaze, lost badly to Carly Fiorina. "Think about California."

The Buck campaign responded to the Chamber's endorsement of Norton by noting that the group never contacted their camp, and pushing back on the suggestion that Norton was the more viable general election candidate.

"If electability were the issue, they've just endorsed a candidate who hasn't won anything," said Buck campaign adviser Will Klein, pointing out that Norton didn't even contest the state's GOP nominating assembly against Buck. "It's not a surprising development. I think that there are a whole bunch of big names in Colorado and DC who have their reputations on the line and who are now scrambling around to figure out what they can do to salvage their reputations."

Norton insisted the endorsement was important because it placed a national marker on the race, highlighting her experience on bread and butter issues.

"It says Jane, we recognize you're a player on health care, we recognize you're a player in economic development," she said.

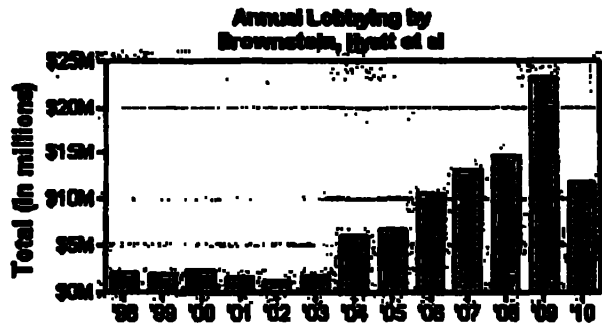

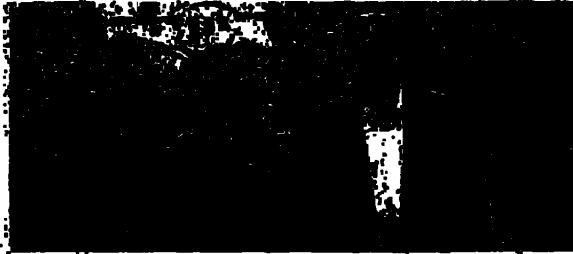

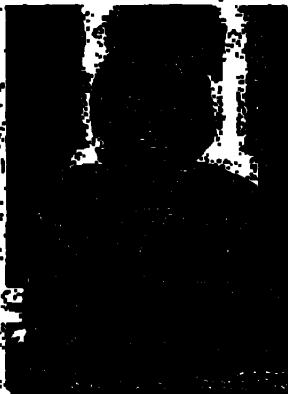


- Colorado's 46th Lieutenant Governor, sworn in January 13, 2003.
