RE: Complaint against The Independence Caucus and its treasurer Frank Anderson
(indirectly raising questions about the FEC compliance of numerous candidates for
federal office who have been endorsed by and aided in their elections by The
Independence Caucus, as well as organizations working in conjunction with ICaucus)

Dear Mr. Hughey, et al.:

I am filing this complaint against The Independence Caucus (FEC ID C00461764), a nonconnected
PAC, see <http://query.nictusa.com/pdf/878/29030192878/29030192878.pdf#navpanes=0>, and its
treasurer, Frank Anderson, for multiple violations of the FEC laws, rules and regulations.

Although I have reason to believe an investigation is warranted into the committees of
candidates who have been endorsed by and aided in their elections by The Independence Caucus, as
well as into some organizations working in conjunction with ICaucus, I do not directly file a complaint
against these other committees and entities at this time.

BACKGROUND

The Independence Caucus started as a group of people who helped Congressman Jason Chaffetz
(R, UT-3) with his 2008 campaign, but they have since expanded nationally, endorsing and helping many
candidates throughout the nation. The Independence Caucus claims the following method to
accomplish their goal of bringing "government control and accountability back to the people": "to find,
vet, endorse and then elect principled candidates." See

- Exclusive Events: Endorsed Candidate Yard Signs, Printing -- Brochures, Bumper Stickers,
Banner and Door Hangings
- Set-up for ICaucus Campaign Teams (to launch efforts for Endorsed Candidates)

In addition, although the Independence Caucus website indicates that they do not give money directly to candidates, they have announced fund-raising wherein the money will be given directly to candidates. FEC VIOLATIONS BY THE INDEPENDENCE CAUCUS

Upon information and belief, nearly two months after the filing deadline for the FEC July 15th 2010 2nd quarter report, the Independence Caucus has failed to file its 2nd quarter report. See <http://query.nictusa.com/cgi-bin/fecimg/?C00461764>.

Upon information and belief, the Independence Caucus was involved in helping candidates who were in contested primary races, but failed to file any pre-primary FEC reports.

Upon information and belief, The Independence Caucus has a history of filing very late FEC reports. See <http://query.nictusa.com/cgi-bin/fecimg/?C00461764>.

Upon information and belief, The Independence Caucus FEC reports, both the April 15th 2010 1st quarter report, as well as the 2009 End of Year Report, contain false information (see below).

Upon information and belief, both the April 15th, 2010 report and the 2009 End of Year Report list all of their contributions and expenditures as \$0.00. Upon information and belief, the Independence Caucus has brought in donations (see below).

Upon information and belief, in early 2010, Frank Anderson of the Independence Caucus boasted at least 12,000 Independence Caucus voting members nationwide. See <http://www.wsmc.com/wsmc-player.cfm/type/windows/show/Washington-Times-Insider-the-Story-Radio/segment/29863.html>.

Upon information and belief, Independence caucus members participate in endorsement votes, but need not necessarily contribute financially, though they are encouraged to do so. See http://www.icaucus.org/index.php?option=com_content&view=article&id=92&Itemid=159.

Upon information and belief, to be an Independence Caucus delegate, one must contribute financially, a minimum contribution of \$40.00. Upon information and belief, only DELEGATES may hold campaign leadership positions, act as Representatives of ICaucus, and participate in interview panels and the annual policy review. Upon information and belief, the Independence Caucus currently boasts 46 endorsed FEDERAL candidates (more before the primaries), from 16 states (more before the primaries), each of whom, in

Upon information and belief, the Independence Caucus has engaged in an endeavor that they call a "big stick tea party," wherein they sponsor an individually personalized Teabag and letter to send to Senator Barbara Boxer (D-CA), or any other incumbent (who is not endorsed by them) throughout the country, for \$5 or \$15, an endeavor that also requires endorsement. Upon information and belief, Independence Caucus volunteers are spending their own money to promote the organization and help candidates, without reporting anything, see, i.e., <http://www.resistnet.com/group/newyorkpatriots/forum/topics/independence-caucus-1?commentId=2600775%3AComment%3A2152636&groupId=2600775%3AGroup%3A40761>.

Upon information and belief, the Independence Caucus has distributed and used candidate yard signs, even sold them on their website, wherein they promote a federal or state candidate, but do not have any disclaimer, and do not require them as law-abiding organizations or in-kind contributions. Upon information and belief, the Independence Caucus has multiple state-of-the-art websites, and a large e-mail list, wherein they support specific federal candidates, but they do not use proper disclaimers on their websites or mass e-mails. Upon information and belief, the Independence Caucus has hired numerous federal candidates with their fundraising efforts. See, i.e., http://www.facebook.com/pages/Independence-Caucus-Southern-California/267632555481?v=app_2309869772.

Upon information and belief, other tea party groups are working in tandem with and directing people to the Independence Caucus if they want to help candidates directly, because unlike them, the Independence Caucus is a PAC. See, i.e., <http://www.rightmichigan.com/story/2010/8/25/18586/3793>.

Upon information and belief, the Independence Caucus was founded by Frank Anderson, Monte Bateman, and Ken Ivory. See http://www.ourcaucus.org/index.php?option=com_content&view=article&id=92&Itemid=159.

Upon information and belief, Ken Ivory is now one of the state endorsed candidates from Utah, and Monte Bateman is running a for-profit organization called iPoliticom, wherein he gets paid to consult candidates, such as those endorsed by the Independence Caucus, and allows iPoliticom to act as a direct support system for the Independence Caucus, once again without any disclosure or reporting. Upon information and belief, the above allegations are just the tip of the iceberg with respect to the Independence Caucus, as the documentation submitted in the appendix contains just a few examples of publicly available information. With such a widespread organization, in so many states, and with so much activity, there are likely many other examples of violations.


CONCLUSION



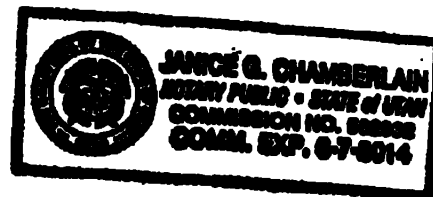

What is iCaucus?

We are Independence Caucus, a Citizen's Organization, dedicated to bring the People back into the Election Process. We are focused on finding Principled Candidates, vetting, endorsing and

campaigning to get them elected. Then holding them accountable to their Principles and Commitments. We are not a Third Party Organization.

Who Are The Founders of iCaucus?'

iCaucus was formed by volunteers from the Jason Chaffetz campaign. Three of the Volunteers put iCaucus together after the successful Campaign that resulted in the elections of Jason Chaffetz in the third district of Utah. Frank Anderson, Monte Bateman and Ken Ivory.

Why "Independence Caucus"?

The name "Independence Caucus" was chosen because we want people to know that we want the same "INDEPENDEN-CE" that our founding fathers gave us, and we chose "caucus" so no one confuses us with a 3rd party movement.

Why We Do Not Endorse Third Party Candidates?

Each is a simple Yes or No question, and each question is a commitment. Candidates must receive a minimum of 70% Yes answers in order to proceed to the interview process.

An interview is then scheduled and conducted by Delegates and subsequently posted to our website for Members and Delegates to review - we refer to this as our Conferencing Period where we research and discuss the Candidate.

When the Conferencing Period closes, Members of the Candidate's State vote to endorse or not endorse.

A single candidate must receive 70% of the Endorsement vote in order to receive an iCaucus Endorsement.

Multiple Candidates must receive 60% of the Endorsement vote in order to receive an iCaucus Endorsement.

Step 4: Candidate Voting by IC Membership

Once the conference period has closed, Caucus Members are then invited to vote for or against endorsement.

- The voting period should last for a minimum of 1 week and no more than 2 weeks.
- Only those qualified members can vote.
- The National Voting Director will send the voting email to the designated members. There will be a one-week period for members to submit their vote. At the end of that week, the National Voting Director will calculate and count the votes. This information will be provided to the Regional Representative who will notify the State or District Representative, the members and the Candidate(s).
- If the vote is to endorse the Candidate, then the Candidate and the members will be notified and a Press Release issued. If the vote is to not endorse then the Candidate and members will be notified. If a 70% for a Candidate vote is not reached then we will not endorse a Candidate in that race.
- If our Candidate does not win the primary, then we will not endorse a Candidate in that race.
- We will not endorse a Third Party Candidate in this election. A vote to if members will be held in January 2021 to decide for the next election whether or not Independence Caucus will amend this policy.

NOTE: The Independence Caucus does not manage or run any candidate's campaign. The candidate's campaign is the sole responsibility of the candidate. However, the Independence Caucus will work with the State and District Representative to develop a Campaign Plan for each Representative. Leonard,

Let me start off by saying that no one at ICaucus receives a salary. The entire organization is a volunteer army of patriots who are sick and tired of it all. The structure of the organization starts at the National Directors level. We have two. Then we are broken up into regions, then into States. Some states have a large membership, so they are broken down into congressional districts. That is my hope for NY. If you go to the ning site you will see the names of the folks that run the national, regional and state areas. On the ning site you will see key contacts and that gives you the names of the directors. I am not sure if it has been updated lately. Obviously we also have folks that are specialists at computer technology that help us develop our website and our new virtual campaign team. Our funding source is by donation. It is completely voluntary, but obviously folks are encouraged to give what they can so we can keep the websites running and pay for any marketing materials. I myself am going to be using my own money to get the word out to NYers about ICaucus through flyers and mailers. I believe so strongly in our mission of integrity over big money that I have no problem using my own funds for this. We do not have any mandatory dues or anything like that either. We get the fact that some folks cannot give money. What we encourage folks to do is give their time instead. If they cannot do that we ask that they just spread the word and stay informed and in touch by going to the websites and reading and replying to our posts. Our goals and mission would be one and the same. Ideally we want to take at least 40% of the congressional and senate seats from our useless incumbents. On the website you will find out that we do not care what 'party flag you fly'. We invite all candidates for office to be vetted by our organization. As I have been going through this process, I have noticed that some candidates are very enthusiastic to be a part of our vetting process and others just ignore us. If you take a look at our initial vetting questionnaire, you will see that it is Constitutionally based. That actually scares away some candidates because most likely they already have an agenda and do not wish to be beholden to the Constitution or to the people, just like many in office now.

Let me give you a little synopsis of the process. First we send out a 11 invitation letter and a sample questionnaire to the candidates. If they wish to be vetted, we send them the official copy of the questionnaire. Once they finish it, they send it back to the national vetting coordinator and he scores it. Then the scores are sent to me for NY candidates and to the other directors for their respective states. Then I set up interview committees who are going to take part in the face to face videotaped record of the interview. This is where I am now. I am seeking folks to take part in the committees. This is the most crucial step. Without this we cannot move the process of endorsement any further. To continue, the committee members will be questioning the candidates on their negative or non answers to the vetting questionnaire. We also have another set of questions that we ask the candidates at the interview. The questions become more and more specific as we go along so we can weed out the BS. We also encourage members to come up with their own questions to ask candidates. No softball, only hardball questions. We do not want any candidate to think this is anything but deadly serious. What they wish to do is of great importance and we let them know in no uncertain terms that they will be beholden to the Constitution and the will of the people or they

BREAKING: Independence Caucus Endorsement for Michigan S.O.S.

Most member organizations of the Michigan Tea Party Alliance are structured as 527 groups. This means that they're not allowed to directly advocate the election or defeat of any candidate for elective office, only to operate on behalf of issue advocacy and voter mobilization. However, the tea party coalitions in several states (including in Michigan) have been strategic partnering with an organization set up specifically as a **Political Action Committee**. This organization combines itself with candidate recruiting, endorsement, and advocacy, with a specific focus on constitutional loyalty and grassroots activists, and an integrity over money.

The Independence Caucus is not a political party, nor is it affiliated with any political party. It is the anti-incumbent, non-affiliated group of concerned citizens devoted to electing candidates truly committed to constitutional loyalty and fiscal responsibility, regardless of party. The goal is the election of such candidates to not less than 40% of the seats in the House and the Senate in 2010... and in each following election year. It is a not-for-profit organization of concerned citizens from all walks who recognize the responsibility to act now to protect future generations of this nation from the dire consequences of our undeniably deficits and debts, and seeks to teach us how to govern our country as citizens, and to provide the practical tools and resources to actually make it happen.

INDEPENDENCE CAUCUS

The Independence Caucus is a unique organization in grassroots politics. They employ a four-phase process that has been likened by one Michigan candidate to a modern-day Spanish Inquisition. The vetting process goes as follows:

- Each filed candidate is invited to respond to an 80-item vetting questionnaire based on constitutional principles. This is done through an on-line survey that is recorded. Each question is treated as a commitment that the candidate is expected to honor once elected. (It should be noted that the entire process is voluntary; no candidate is actually compelled to complete the vetting process.)
- All responding candidates who commit to at least 70% of the vetting questions (56 of the 80) are prepared for a panel interview. The preparation consists of the delegate team scouring a candidate's entire public record, flagging anything that doesn't square with the questionnaire responses, and preparing open-ended questions based on their research. The interview itself is done by a panel of five delegates, typically lasts for two to three hours, and like the questionnaire is recorded for later review.
- Once completed, the interviews for all candidates for the seat in question are securely posted online for I-Caucus members to review. This is followed by an online conference period of 1 to 2 weeks where members may ask additional questions and discuss any issues regarding the candidates. Historical research may be done and posted to the discussion thread for comment and consideration.
- Once the conference period ends, a vote survey is sent to all members of the district or state with a request to endorse or not to endorse. All members in the district or state of the candidate are invited to vote on endorsements. A candidate who is unopposed in the vetting process must receive a 70% "in favor" vote for endorsement. With multiple candidate votes, one must receive a 80% super-majority of the competitive vote for endorsement; if no candidate receives at least 66%, then the top two are selected for a runoff vote.

And I can promise you that no other organization in American politics does this. The concept behind the vetting process is fairly simple: Any candidate who lies to someone in a newspaper advertisement, television or radio ad, or in campaign literature... that no candidate is going to be able to lie his way through this system without being exposed and by someone.

The Independence Caucus, as a nationwide organization, has a policy against endorsing third party candidates. The policy is based on the principle of **Everett's Law**, which asserts that a single-member, district-purity (SMDP) voting system - which is how it's done in America - will eventually coalesce into a two-party political system, even when we'd rather that it didn't. In forming their policy, the I-Caucus leadership cites the precedent of the four founding Fathers (John Adams, Alexander Hamilton, Thomas Jefferson, and James Madison) who developed the American two-party system before George Washington had even completed his first term of office as President. Every other party that has formed since that time has always done so out of the desire of a compromise.

If the founding Fathers couldn't figure out how to overcome Dunsmuir's Law, then no one in this day and age is likely to be able to do so. However, in 2008 the I-Caucus did prove that, by acting as an independent caucus within the two existing major parties, it is possible to root out compromised incumbents and take back control from the out of touch elites currently holding office.

The Michigan Tea Party Alliance, including the Michigan Chapter of the Independence Caucus, is well aware of the importance of the Secretary of State election this year. The Michigan Democratic Party, and their national alliance, is trying to force us to let other state-level races to see degrees that they are focused on this. By letting control of the Secretary of State, George Soros and his not-so-secret can place themselves in position to manipulate the elections process in each controlled state. We know that, their claims to the contrary, it will be done by destroying the sanctity of the ballot box and casting votes upon the floor to election fraud... all in the name of the Socialist-Marxist version of preventing vote suppression.

Jocelyn Benson is the SOS Project (read: ACORN/SEIU) choice to challenge for the open seat being vacated by term-limited Terri Lynn Lantieri. Members nationwide vote on candidates after receiving their questionnaire and a lengthy interview process. I-Caucus promotes limited government, fiscal responsibility, and adherence to Constitutional authority.

The goal of I-Caucus members is to bring government control and accountability back to the people, remove the influence and control of "big money" special interest groups and to hold our representatives accountable to their promises and principles.

Ruth Johnson responded to the endorsement saying, "It is an honor to have earned the confidence of the members of I-Caucus. As a pro-life, pro-traditional marriage, and pro-Constitution candidate, my core values are very much in line with those promoted by the I-Caucus. This is truly an honor."

Johnson, the Oakland County Clerk/Registrar of Deeds, is a former state representative who investigated government waste and mismanagement, leading to a public official's resignation. As Clerk, she has earned a national award for innovation, cost-cutting, promoting integrity in elections, and promoting transparency in government.

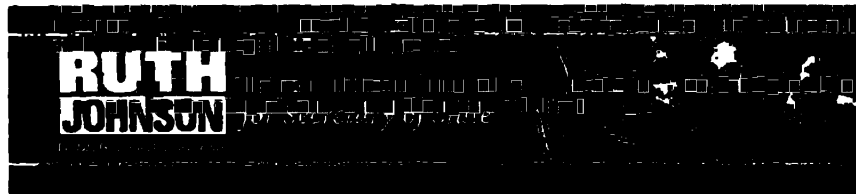
The support of I-Caucus members at this weekend's Republican State Convention in East Lansing will give a key factor in the nomination of Ruth Johnson for Secretary of State.

Ruth Johnson earned 61% of the vote in the competitive runoff, only barely enough to earn the endorsement, but earning it nevertheless. In announcing this endorsement, Donald Ballal, Independence Caucus Region Eleven Director, said, "Ruth has a wide range of experience that prepares her for this office. She had a conservative voting record in the Michigan House, and is the clerk of a very large county. Ruth also concurs with the Independence Caucus principles on the hot-button issues facing our state in elections, driver's license, and driver responsibility fees."

It should be noted that, in her last election, Johnson lost the state political director for ACORN for the office that she now holds. In 2006, she ran statewide as the fiscal and social conservative Lieutenant Governor nominee with Bill Delpas. Recent statewide polling holds Johnson ahead of Jocelyn Benson, the Secretary's candidate for Secretary of State, by 18 percent.

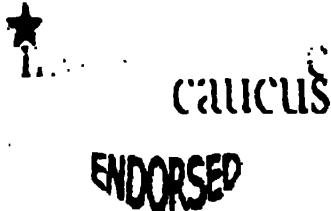
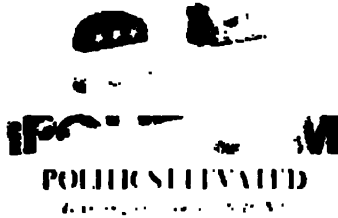

Conservatives Unite!!!

With the 2010 elections fast approaching many people are jumping into various camps to back their chosen candidates and support their various pet issues. The 2010 and 2012 elections are the most important for conservatives in many years. Now's not the time to engage in turf wars. 2. Independence Caucus conducts specific research on incumbents to show the link to their voting

records & earmarks, and which big money special interest groups have donated to their campaigns and how much they've donated (it's a whole lot more than the media reports). They then use that research to give our endorsed candidates an advantage in campaigning against that incumbent particularly in and they create videos exposing the incumbents activities to the light of day as demonstrated by the Bower Briefs or the Taylor Film videos.

3. I'm constantly stressing to both candidates and activists alike that "all politics is local" and we have a strong knowledge of how politics works down to a precinct level and how to organize and mobilize the precincts in order to win elections. iPoliticom conducts training for candidates and their volunteers on how to do this successfully. I proud to say that I helped Jason Chaffetz from Utah's third Congressional district win his race against a six-term incumbent who outspent Jason 6:1 and we managed to beat this incumbent by 20 points! Unheard of in todays recent political history. For those who don't know, Jason Chaffetz is the Congressman who sleeps on his cot in his Washington office to save the tax payers money.
4. iPoliticom will also train a candidates volunteers on the 37 positions necessary to turn their election day into a decisive victory, even against those incumbents who are owned by the big money special interest groups.
5. iPoliticom also teaches candidates and their volunteers how to use the internet tools most effectively for building a strong campaign and bringing in big money into their campaign.

Can we agree that this is the direction we all want to go? Let's join forces instead of creating conservative group after conservative group--most of which simply replicate the function of already existing groups. As good conservative candidates promote themselves for our support, dividing into these kinds of factions becomes increasingly counter productive and diffuses our focus and effectiveness. To help accomplish all of this, here in Utah we are holding an Activist Seminar and Workshop Day with several speakers who will be sharing the personal knowledge about current issues and equally important, how to band together to win in 2010. If we are divided we WILL fail. But if we are united we will SUCCEED!

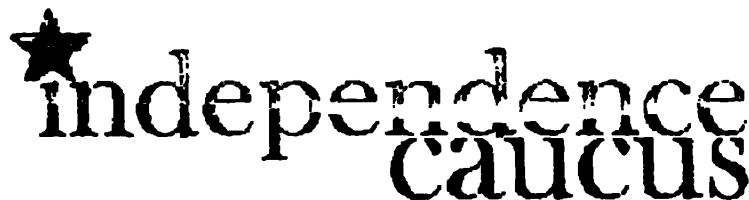

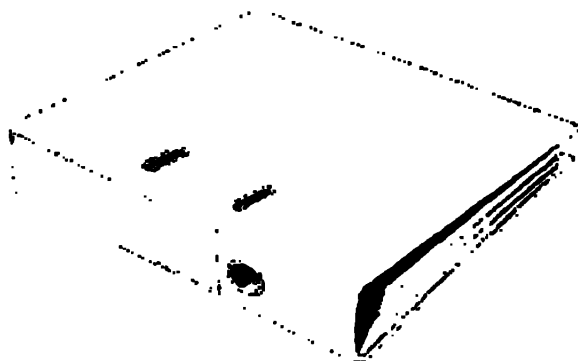

The Candidate's Binder

This is just a little trick you'll need to know that will help you as you are out on the road campaigning. Keep a binder with you at all times. That binder should contain all the planks in your platform, where you stand on important issues that concern your potential constituents, questions that are asked in forums, town hall meetings, and cottage meetings, the research you've done on those questions, and your supporting materials to give you all the ammunition you need to skewer your opponent and answer hardball questions from reporters, delegates, potential constituents, etc.

Organize your binder as follows:

Section 1 – Your Platform, where you stand on each issue, proposed solutions to those issues. Each issue should have its own divider within that section

Section 2 – The communities within your voting district. If you are running for city council or mayor, break it down precinct by precinct. If you are running for a state or federal office, then break it down city by city. Each city or precinct gets there own tab. What are the issues or concerns that that specific bloc of constituents cares about the most? Have that in there and cross referenced to the material in sections 1 & 2.

Section 3 – Your Opposition research. Where does your opponent stand on key issues? What areas do you differ? What is his/her voting record and how can you capitalize on it and how he/she has conducted themselves while in office. How have they responded to their constituents? Who have they taken money from. Who have they given earmarks to. And so on and so forth.

This binder can be a key element to your success if you have the discipline to maintain it and use it properly.

Recognize this guy? Every election year good men and women lose elections to candidates with more money who don't deserve to win, because they don't understand the fundamentals which need to be implemented into their campaign in order TO win. Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Why is your organization a for profit corporation instead of a non-profit corporation?

A. As a for profit corporation we are allowed to serve candidates as campaign consultants, something we would be restricted under FEC rules if we were a non-profit.

Q. As your company earns profits, how are those profits put to use?

A. We pay staff to help candidates and their volunteers win elections. We also reinvest the money to develop tools that will help the candidates on their campaigns.

Q. Does the founder receive a salary?

A. The founder is paid sufficient to take care of his family's needs so he can devote his time and efforts in helping conservative candidates and promoting the conservative cause in general.

Q. How do you know that your company can help candidates win elections?

A. The founder has a track record of success. He was the online campaign director for Rep. Jason Chaffetz's (R-UT) campaign in Utah's third congressional district in 2008. He helped defeat a 6 term incumbent who outspent Jason's campaign 6-1, was endorsed by all three major newspapers in the district, received the endorsement of the sitting president, and both Utah Senators. When the founder joined the campaign, Jason was polling at 4% of the vote in the district and debate sponsors refused to invite him. Five weeks later, the founder helped Jason win in the primary election, beating the incumbent by 20 points taking 60% of the vote.

Q. How many members do you have in your organization?

A. We are not a membership based organization.

Q. How long has iPoliticom been in existence?

A. In November of 2008, a month after winning the election, the founder put together his business plan to begin helping promote conservative politicians. iPoliticom was formally incorporated in December of 2009 in the State of Utah.

Q. Do you endorse or support specific candidates?

A. iPoliticom does not endorse candidates. We are however, committed to providing campaign support to conservative candidates who hire us for our services.

Q. How do you decide which candidates you will support?

A. We provide support only for conservative candidates who have been vetted and endorsed by organizations and individuals whose vetting process and opinions we trust. We do not support RINOs or Progressives, and will only support candidates who can prove to us that they are fiscally responsible.

Q. Who is your founder and who are your directors?

A. Founder and Chairman of the Board – Monte Bateman, Mapleton, UT; Director – Michelle King, Logan, UT; Director –

Q. How do you generate revenue?

A. By conducting fundraising for politicians, and hiring out our services to conservative candidates.

Q. What are the requirements for becoming a member and how do I become a member?

A. We are not a membership based organization, but we are always able to find ways for you to help the conservative cause if you are able and willing.

Q. What if I want to volunteer to help your organization achieve its goals—is there a way for me to do this?

A. We welcome any and all volunteers who have a strong desire to get involved and make a difference, and we do have volunteer internship positions within our organization so you can learn how to make a difference and put that knowledge to real practical use.

Q. Are you partnered with any other groups?

A. We are not officially partnered with any groups at the present time. However there are several groups who share our ideology and goals and we work with them whenever it is appropriate and legal to do so.

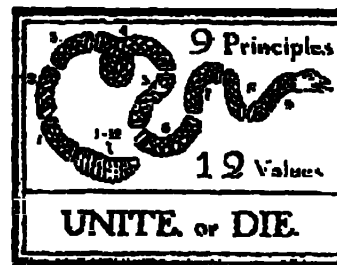
