The Stutzman for Congress Committee is in receipt of Supervisory Attorney Jeff S. Jordan's letter of Oct. 28, 2010 regarding a complaint received by the Commission. For the reasons detailed herein, the Committee believes that no action should be taken against it or any of its agents as respondents.

The complaint alleges that several large signs posted at various locations in or near Kendallville, Indiana, did not include a required disclaimer. The complainant reports contacting a campaign volunteer and asking that the signs be removed. The complaint is dated one day after complainant reports making that contact.

These signs were neither paid for nor authorized by the Stutzman for Congress Committee, or Representative Stutzman. Although whomever paid for and posted the signs may have had a requirement to include an appropriate disclaimer, that requirement applied to that person and not to the Committee.

The Committee has no information regarding the identity of the person or organization that had these signs produced and posted.
