To whom it may concern,

Attached you will find a copy of an electronic ad appearing on the website of the Omaha *World-Herald* at <http://www.omaha.com>. The ad lacks the required box around the disclaimer,

According to the FEC, Political committees must include a disclaimer on (1) all "public communications" (defined below), (2) bulk electronic email (defined as electronic mail with more than 500 substantially similar communications) and (3) web sites available to the general public, regardless of whether the communication expressly advocates the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate, or solicits funds in connection with a federal election (i.e., contributions for a federal candidate or federal political committee).

A public communication is defined as including: "Any other general public political advertising. General public political advertising does not include Internet ads, except for communications placed for a fee on another person's web site."

As found in Sec. 110.11 Communications; advertising; disclaimers (2 U.S.C 441d), the regulations state that the "disclaimer must be contained in a printed box set apart from the other contents of the communication."

Lee Terry's ad clearly is lacking the box around the written disclaimer on an ad placed for a fee on Omaha.com, which would seem to be a FEC violation.





Heinman, Bruning return to politics

LINCOLN — Gov. Dave Heinman and Attorney General Jon Bruning mistakenly accepted \$2,500 each in campaign contributions from a Canadian company seeking to build a crude-oil pipeline across Nebraska.

The contributions, from designers or foreign corporations such as TransCanada Inc., are illegal under Nebraska campaign finance laws.

Heinman, executive director of the Nebraska Accountability and Disclosure Commission, said Tuesday that an auditor in his office recently noticed the contributions from TransCanada, which has a satellite office in Omaha but is based in Calgary, Alberta.

He said he alerted the campaign about the issue last week and said both have since returned the contributions. The state, he said, has no laws banning such donations, and his office would not take additional action.

John Quisen, a spokesman with the Federal Election Commission, said if someone filed a complaint about the donations, the office would investigate.

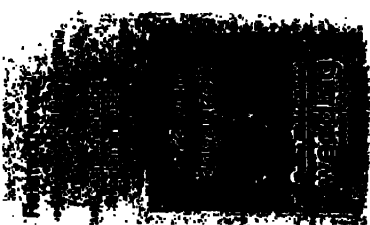

Environmentalists have criticized the project as unnecessary because a network of existing water drawn from the Ogallala Aquifer and to bore forest lands of Canada.

A spokesman for Heinman's campaign did not immediately return phone calls seeking comment.

Holley Bolen, a spokeswoman for the Bruning campaign, said the campaign is currently reviewing the situation and has applied to state officials for a suspension of campaign "this independence of action," she said. The campaign decided to return the money.
