Dear Ms. Corley and Messrs. Elias and Reese:

On November 1, 2010, the Federal Election Commission ("Commission") notified your clients of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. On May 31, 2011, the Commission found, on the basis of the information in the complaint and information provided by you, that there is no reason to believe Women Vote! and Ellen Malcolm, in her official capacity as treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 441a(a) or 441b. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Statement of Policy Regarding Disclosure of Closed Enforcement and Related Files, 68 Fed. Reg. 70,426 (Dec. 18, 2003) and Statement of Policy Regarding Placing First General Counsel's Reports on the Public Record, 74 Fed. Reg. 66132 (Dec. 14, 2009). The Factual and Legal Analysis, which explains the Commission's finding, is enclosed for your information.
