Dear Mr. Jordan:

This response, including exhibits, is submitted on behalf of Art Robinson for Congress (the "Robinson Campaign") and Noah Robinson, as Treasurer (collectively "Respondents"), in response to a complaint filed on December 6, 2010 by Trent Lutz, Executive Director of the Democratic Party of Oregon ("DPO" or "the Democratic Party").

The Democratic Party's imaginative complaint alleges a laundry list of violations, including claims that Respondents received excessive contributions and illegal corporate contributions, failed to report in-kind contributions and contribution conduits, failed to use their best efforts to collect and report contributor information and failed to satisfy various disclaimer requirements. These allegations are based not on facts, but on the DPO's blatant speculation as to what the Rubinson Campaign "must" have done during the 2010 election. The speculative nature of the complaint makes it clear that this reatter is a bisiant attempt to impose legal com's on the Robinson Campaign, to insimilate Dr. Robinson from runsing again in 2012 and to simply squander the limited resources of the Federal Election Commission ("FRC" or "the Commission"). Thus, for the reasons stated below, the Commission should take no further action against Respondents and close this matter.

1. Summary of the Facts & Legal Arguments

On April 16, 2010, Trent Lutz, Executive Director of the DPO, filed a baseless complaint with the FEC in an attempt to densil Republican candidate Dr. Arthur Rubinson from his campaign to be elected to a seat in the House of Representatives for Oregon's Fourth Congressional District. See Complaint, MUR 6273 (Art Robinson for Congress, et al.) (April 15, 2010). On September 3, 2010, by a vote of 6 to 0, the Commission dismissed the DPO's complaint based, in part, on its findings that the allegations were "speculative in nature." See General Counsel's Report, MUR 6273 (Art Robinson for Congress, et al.) (Aug. 19, 2010); accord Certification, MUR 6273 (Art Robinson for Congress) (Sept. 3, 2010).

Despite being successful in defending against the DPO's frivolous claims, however, Dr. Robinson was unsuccessful in his campaign for Congress, losing to Democratic incumbent Peter DeFazio by a small margin. Dr. Robinson won 44.5% of the vote with DeFazio winning 53.7%. Neverthaless, Dr. Robinson announced that he would run for election again in 2012. In response to Dr. Robinson's announcement, on December 6, 2010, the Democratic Party again filed this meritless complaint against the Robinson Campaign and its Treasurer. See Complaint, MUR 6438 (Art Robinson for Congress) (Dec. 6, 2010).

Notaing lies at the heart of this action except the Democratic Pany's disturbing attempt to handicap a serious threat to Representative DaFazio's re-election in 2012. The Democratic Party's complaint is a brazen attempt to force Dr. Robinson to expend his resources responding to ridiculous allegations, several of which the PEC has already considered and rejected.

In the complaint, the Democratic Party alleges that Respondents received excessive campaign contributions by collecting over \$2,400 from individual contributors. This allegation is simply false. The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. § 431 et seq. ("FECA"), provides that Respondents could collect more than \$2,400 per contributor because

Dr. Robinson participated in separate elections to win the nominations of the Republican and Independent parties. See Or. Rev. Stat. § 248.099; Adv. Op. 2094-20, 1978-30.

The DPO also speculates that Respondents use of Access to Energy and the Robinson Curriculum's subscriber lists for fundraising constituted illegal corporate contributions. This allegation was based on DPO's mere suspicion that either Althouse Press or the Oregon Institute of Science and Medicine (or "OISM") must own either Access to Energy and the Robinson Curriculum's subscriber lists, and must have given both lists to Respondents to use for fundraising. This too is false as neither Althouse Press nor OISM own either subscriber lists. Also, Althouse Press cannot make an illegal corporate contribution because it is not a corporation, as the Commission already determined in MUR 6273. See General Counsel's Report, MUR 6273 (Art Robinson for Congress, et al.) (Aug. 19, 2010).

Next, the DPO contends that Respondents were required to report use of Access to Energy and the Robinson Curriculum's subscriber lists as in-kind contributions. This contention is erroneous because the Access to Energy subscriber list is Dr. Robinson's personal property and the cost of renting the Robinson Curriculum's list was less than the \$200 reporting requirement for disbursements. Thus, no reporting was necessary. See 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.13(a)(1), 104.3(a)(4)(i).

The DPO farther fabricates that Respondents had to report Access to Energy, Althouse Press or OISM as conduits that received and forwarded contributions to Respondents. The DPO's argument is based solely on the fact that Access to Energy and Althouse Press shared a post office bon with the Robinson Campaign. The Commission, however, has already rejected the DPO's prior claim that the Robinson Campaign could not share the same post office box with Access to Energy and Althouse Press. See General Counsel's Report, MUR 6273 at 2 (Art Robinson for Congress, et al.) (Aug. 19, 2010). Further, Access to Energy and Althouse Press cannot be corporate conduits because neither are "persons" capable of being a conduit under the

Act. See 11 C.F.R. § 110.10. Also, no contributions were sent to OISM's address. Accordingly, this claim too holds no weight.

The DPO goes on to allege that Respondents failed to use their best efforts to collect and report contributor occupation and employer information. See 11 C.F.R. § 104.7(b)(1). Respondents, however, earnestly sought to obtain the requisite information. Respondents sent contributors who failed to provide occupation and employer information a follow-up letter clearly requesting the missing information. In fact, despite their statutory obligation to send only one follow-up letter, Respondents sent multiple letters to contributors in an effort to obtain and report the requisite information. Moreover, Respondents took remedial action upon realizing any information was missing. Thus, the matter does not warrant the FEC's attention.

Finally, the DPO claims Respondents' solicitations failed to contain the appropriate disclaimers regarding who paid for the communication. Despite the DPO's contentions, the May 2010 edition of Access to Energy clearly stated on the third page of the newsletter that the candidate paid for the issues of Access to Energy that contained solicitations, which satisfies 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(c)(2)(iv). Respondents admit that this information was inadvertently omitted from the March 2010 edition of Access to Energy. Similarly, an attachment accompanying the September 5, 2010 solicitation letter to Access to Energy readers clearly contains the required disclaimer that the letter was paid for by Art Robinson for Congress. Finally, Respondents made a good faith effort to comply with the statute by attempting to include the required disclaimer on the emails to the Robinson Curriculum subscribers, but the disclaimer was omitted due to a simple technical error.

Accordingly, Respondents Art Robinson for Congress and Noah Robinson respectfully request that the Commission reject the Democratic Party's frivolous complaint, conserve its resources for more significant matters, and close this matter without taking any additional action against Respondents.

II. STATEMENT OF THE FACTS

In March 2010, Dr. Arthur Robinson sought the Republican nomination for a seat in the House of Rapresentatives representing Oregon's Fourth Congressional District. Dr. Robinson is a scientist and educator who had never run for elected affine before 2010 and had no experience running a campaign. Although Dr. Robinson's son, Noah Robinson, had no experience working on campaigns, he offered to assist his father on the Robinson Campaign by serving as Treasurer and Campaign Manager. Unfortunately, in November 2010, Dr. Robinson lost the general election to Congressman Peter DeFazio. Nonetheless, Dr. Robinson has made it clear that he will run against Congressman DeFazio again in 2012.

As thoroughly discussed in MUR 6273, Dr. Robinson is a scientist and educator directly associated with Access to Energy, Althouse Press, and the Oregon Institute of Science and Medicine. See General Cosmel's Report, MUR 6273 (Art Robinson for Congress, et al.) (Aug. 19, 2010). Access to Energy and Althouse Press are not corporations and have no employees. Access to Energy is a monthly science and engineering newsletter Dr. Robinson writes and publishes though Althouse Press and distributes to almost 3,500 friends, family and colleagues in the scientific community. Althouse Press is registered with the Oregon Secretary of State as an assumed business name. See Oregon Secretary of State, Business Registry Business Name Search (attached as Exhibit 1). Dr. Robinson pays all of the production and mailing costs related to Access to Energy out of his own pocket. Income from Access to Energy, if any, is reported as Dr. Robinson's personal income on his annual income tax returns. The Robinson Curriculum is a home-schooling curriculum designed by Dr. Robinson and his late wife and sold by Dr. Robinson.

OISM is a 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3) non-profit research institute Dr. Robinson formed to conduct scientific research. It operates solely from the support of donations from private individuals and other entities. OISM is located at 2251 Dick George Road in Cave Junction, Oregon, on a 500-acre ranch where Dr. Robinson also lives. Because the ranch does not receive

direct mail delivery, mail sent to Dr. Robinson, Robinson for Congress, Access to Energy and Althouse Press is delivered to a common post office wax in the Cave Junction, Oregon post office. Mail sent to OISM is delivered to a suparate post office box at the same post office.

III. LEGAL ARGUMENTS

The DPO's complaint consists largely of allegations that the Commission has either already rejected in MUR 6723 or that are based on sheer speculation. See General Counsel's Report, MUR 6273 (Art Robinson for Congress, et al.) (Aug. 19, 2010). Thus, this Commission should dismiss the DPO's complaint as it warrants no further attention.

First, Respondents did not solicit er receive excessive campaign contributions. The Robinson Campaign was entitled to raise funds under separate \$2,400 limits for the Republican Party primary and the insleptandent Party primary because they were reparate elections under Oregon and federal law. Second, Respondents did not receive illegal corporate contributions from Althouse Press or OISM by using the subscriber lists of Access to Energy and the Robinson Curriculum to raise funds, because neither Althouse Press nor OISM own those subscriber lists. And, as the Democratic Party is well-aware, Althouse Press is not a corporation and thus cannot make illegal corporate contributions.

Third, Respondents did not have to report using Access to Energy or the Rebisson Curriculture's subscriber lists as in-kind contributions because the Access to Energy subscriber list is Dr. Robinson's personal property and the cost of renting the Robinson Curriculum's list was less than the \$200 reporting requirement for disbursements. Fourth, Respondents did not have to report Access to Energy, Akinouse Press or OISM as combains that received and forwanded contributions. Access to Energy and Althouse Press cannot be conduits because neither are a "person" as defined by the Act. See 11 C.F.R. § 110.10. Moreover, the mere fact that Access to Energy and Althouse Press shared a common post office box with the Robinson

Campaign does not mean that either entity was a conduit for contributions to the campaign.

Finally, OISM was not a conduit because it never received any contributions for the campaign.

Fifth, notwithstanding the DPO's claims, Respondents used their best efforts to collect and report contributor information. 11 C.F.R. § 104.7(b)(1). Respondents earnestly sought to obtain employer and occupation information by sending contributors several letters clearly requesting the necessary information be provided and returned in self-addressed, stamped envelopes. And sixth, Respondents' solicitations largely satisfied the Act's disclaimer requirement regarding who paid for the solicitation but inadvertently omitted the best efforts disclaimer. Nonetheiess, Respondents' solicitations clearly conveyed that either Dr. Robinson or the Robinson Committee authorized and paid for them and no member of the public would have been anisled otherwise.

Accordingly, Art Robinson for Congress and Noah Robinson respectfully request that the Commission disregard the Democratic Party's frivolous claims, conserve its resources for more significant matters, and close this matter without taking any further action.

1. Respondents Did Not Receive Excessive Contributions

The Democratic Party alleges that the Robinson Campaign received excessive contributions in violation of 2 U.S.C. § 441a, which prohibits candidates from receiving more than \$2,400 per election from any person. 2 U.S.C. § 441a(a)(1). The DPO's allegations are meritless as all contributions received by the Robinson Campaign were within statutory limits. In fact, the DPO's claim that Respondents could not receive contributions in consection with the Independent Party primary is incorrect as a matter of law. Further, the Committee has taken all necessary steps to correct any error regarding excessive contributions. Accordingly, the DPO's argument fails.

Despite the DPO's claim, the Robinson Campaign was entitled to raise funds under separate \$2,400 limits for the Republican Party primary and the Independent Party primary because they were separate elections. The Act defines an election to include "a general, special, primary, or ranoff election[.]" 2 U.S.C. § 431(1)(A) and (B); accord see 11 C.F.R. § 100.2. The issue of whether a particular event constitutes an election is governed by the relevant state law.

See Adv. Op. 2004-20, 1992-25, 1986-17, 1984-16. Under Oregon law, minor parties are authorized to nominate candidates and to conduct their own primaries. See Or. Rev. Stat. § 248.009 (2010). The Commission has held that any primary which results in a candidate receiving the nomination of a party is considered a separate election for which the candidate may accept contributions under 2 U.S.C. § 441. See Adv. Op. 2004-20 (holding candidate may accept contributions for each election she was involved in during the primary process); Adv. Op. 1978-30 (holding candidate may accept multiple contributions from an individual where the candidate is selected by the convention as a nominer to run in the ensulag primary and/or general election). Hence, in such consumatances, candidates may accept multiple contributions of \$2,400 per person where each contribution is for a separate election. See Adv. Op. 2004-20, 1978-30.

Here, Respondents were entitled to accept two \$2,490 contributions from the same person because Dr. Robinson was involved in two separate primary elections. Dr. Robinson was a candidate in the Republican Party primary and the Independent Party primary.² Oregon law permits the Independent Party as a minor party to nominate its own candidate and conduct its own primary. As a candidate for both parties, Dr. Robinson ran in both primary elections and Respondents lawfully collected funds to support his campaign. See Adv. Op. 2004-20, 1978-30.

¹ The Etamografia Party was well-means that the Independent Party was purnished to conduct its swn primary under Oregon law. Two of the Democratic Party's nominees for Congress also ran for the Independent Party nomination in their respective congressional districts. In fact, Democratic Congressman Peter DeFazio ran against Dr. Robinson for the Independent Party nomination, but was defeated by Dr. Robinson who won 56% of the vote. See Exhibit 2.

The Democratic Party erroneously claimed that Dr. Robinson raised funds separately for the Constitution Party nomination. This is false. Dr. Robinson merely participated in the Constitution Party convention.

Moreover, the DPO misplaces its reliance on Advisory Opinions 1982-47 and 1994-29 to support its argument that candidates steking the nontination of multiple parties cannot raise funds under separate limits for each numbration sought. In these epinions, the Commission forbade New York congressional candidates from cellacting funds above the stantary limit because the New York minor party primaries occurred on the same day as the Republican Party primary. See Adv. Op. 1994-29, 1982-47. In Respondents' case, the Republican Party primary was on May 18, 2010 and the Independent Party primary was on July 30, 2010. Thus, the rationale in Advisory Opinions 1982-47 and 1994-29 is not applicable here. Despite the DPO's allegations, Respondents' receipt of contributions after the date of the Republican Party primary election was not unlawful because those contributions were accepted for the Independent Party primary and not to retire debt from the Republican Party primary. See 11 C.F.R. § 110.1(b)(3)(i).

Moreover, the Commission's Reports Analysis Division ("RAD") authorized Respondents to accept additional contributions for the Independent Party primary. In an effort to ensure compliance with the FECA, counsel for Respondents contacted the Robinson Campaign's RAD analyst, Benjamin J. Holly, on three separate occasions in June, July and September of 2010 regarding the issue of accepting contributions for the Independent Party primary. Mr. Holly and RAD Branch Division Chief Madalyn Lane instructed Respondents that, because the Commission had failed to decide whether the Independent Party of Oregon primary was a separate election under the FECA, the Reports Analysis Division would not consider contributions made in connection with the Independent Party primary to be excessive even if the same contributor had already given the maximum \$2.400 contribution in connection with the

³ Furnitumons, the Atherest Opinion the Democratic Purp relies upon makes clear that the Embinson Campaign was authorized to accept funds for each primary election! Advisory Opinion 1982-47 plainly states that the "[\$2400] limitations to a candidate uniter he is a candidate in more size one election." Adv. Op. 1982-47 (emphasis added). Hence, not only is the Democratic Party incorrect in its conclusion and erroneous in its analysis, but it has disregarded the law to further its ill-motivated campaign to discredit Respondents before the Commission.

Republican Party primary. Mr. Holly instructed Respondents to report any contributions received for the Independent Party primary as contributions for an "other" election. Respondents fully complied with his instruction. See Exhibit 3. Thus, Respondents did not violate the Act.

Finally, the DPO complaint alleges that the Robinson Campaign illegally accepted four specific excessive contributions. In fact, as the DPO should have known, the Robiuson Campaign has taken the required steps to either refund or reattribute those contributions. First, the excess contribution made by Mr. David Lawson was returned on October 25, 2010 and the refund was reported accordingly on the Robinson Campaign's 30-Day Post-General Election Report. That report was filed with the Commission on December 2, 2010 - four days before the DPO filed the complaint in this matter. See Exhibit 4. The contributions of Messrs. Cliff Naser and Dorsen Unilwak aspear to be excessive because the Robinson Campalga inadvertently attributed to them constributions that hat in fact been made by their spouses. The Robinson Campaign has filed accentled October 15th Quarterly and 12-Day Pre-General Election Reports reattributing the Naser and Unthank contributions to their respective spouses. See Exhibit 5. Finally, John Tomkins' contribution was identified as excessive by the Respondents and they are in the process of returning the \$600 excess to the contributor. That refund will appear on the Robinson Campaign's next report to the Commission. Accordingly, the Commission should disregard the Democratic Party's baseless claims that the Robinson Campaign received excessive contributions.

2. <u>Respondents Did.Not Practive Illegal Corporate Contributions</u>

The Democratic Party attempts to revive allegations that the Commission has already rejected in MUR 6273. See General Counsel's Report, MUR 6273 (Art Robinson for Congress, et al.) (Aug. 19, 2010). The DPO speculates that Respondents received illegal corporate contributions from Althouse Press and OISM in violation of 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(f), which prohibits corporations from making or facilitating contributions to candidates. § 114.2(f)(1), (f)(2)(i)(C). More specifically, the Democratic Party assumes that either Althouse Press or

OISM must own the Access to Energy and the Robinson Curriculum subscriber lists and must have given both lists to Respondents to use for fundamising. These allegations are simply false based on facts known to the DPO when it filed this complaint.

Foremost, neither Althouse Press nor OISM own the Access to Energy or the Robinson Curriculum's subscriber lists. Thus, neither could have facilitated Respondents' use of the lists. In fact, the Robinson Campaign paid the Robinson Curriculum 4 cents per name to send solicitations to a portion of the Curriculum's e-mail list. The cost of renting the list amounted to less than the \$200 reporting requirement for itemized disbursements. See 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.3(a)(4)(i), 104.13(a)(1).

Further, Althouse Press could not engage in corporate facilitation because it is not a corporation. Althouse Press is merely a fictitious business name used by Dr. Robinson and "nothing more than one of Robinson's personal assets." See General Counsel's Report, MUR 6273 (Art Robinson for Congress, et al.) (Aug. 19, 2010). This was made clear in the FEC's dismissul of the DPO's first unfounded complaint against Dr. Robinson. Id.

Indeed, the Democratic Party's fanciful allegations are nothing more than political shemmings and conduct worthy of sametion. Thus, its complaint should be dismissed.

3. Respondents Were Not Required to Report Use of the Asspar to Energy or the Robinson Curriculum's Subscriber Lists as In-Kind Contributions

Despite the Democratic Party's claims that Respondent violated reporting requirements under 2 U.S.C. § 434, Respondents did not have to report using the Access to Energy or the Robinson Curriculum subscriber lists. As stated, Access to Energy is simply a science newsletter Dr. Robinson personally creates and publishes. Its subscriber list is a subsuit of Dr. Robinson's personal rolodex of friends, family and scientific polleagues. The Commission has never held that a candidate's use of his personal rolodex to solicit contributions requires the candidate to assign a fair market value to the list and report it as an in-kind contribution.

Respondents were not required to report the rental of the Robinson Curriculum subscriber list either. The Robinson Campaign paid the Robinson Curriculum to rent 3,278 email addresses — not 60,000 — from the Robinson Curriculum subscriber list at a cost of 4 cents per name. The cost of renting these addresses amounted to \$131.12, which did not have to be itemized in a report as it was less than \$200. See 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.3(a)(4)(i), 104.13(a)(1). Thus, Respondents were not required to report using either the Access to Energy or the Robinson Curriculum's subscriber list as in-kind contributions.

4. Reprendents Nord Not Roport Access to Energy. Althouse Press or OISM as Conduits

The Democratic Farty's allegation that Access to Energy, Althouse Press and OISM acted as conduits for the Robinson Campaign is patently ridiculous.

Under the Act, a candidate or committee must report each conduit or intermediary who forwards contributions in excess of \$200 from the contributor to the candidate or committee. See 11 C.F.R. § 110.6(C)(2)(i). A conduit or intermediary means "any person who receives and forwards an earmarked contribution to a candidate or a candidate's authorized committee." 11 C.F.R. § 110.6(b)(1). Neither Access to Energy nor Althouse Press or OISM were conduits for the Robinson Campaign.

The DPO's conduit argument is based solely on the fact that Access to Energy and Althouse Press shared a post office box with the Robinson Campaign. The Commission, however, has already rejected the DPO's prior claim that the Robinson Campaign could not share the same post office box with Access to Energy and Althouse Press. See Geomal Counsel's Report, MUR 6273 at 2 (Art Robinson for Congress). Also, the Robinson Campaign's use of the common post office box was paid for by Dr. Robinson and reported as an in-kind contribution. See Exhibit 6.

In addition, Access to Energy and Althouse Press cannot be conduits because neither are "persons" as defined by the Act; rather, they are just alter-egos of Dr. Robinson as the Commission less stressly determined in MUR 6273. See 11 C.F.R. § 100.10 ("Person resums are individual, partnership, commissee, association, corporation, labor organization, and any other organization, or group of persons. . ."); accord see General Counsel's Report, MUR 6273 at 3 (Art Robinson for Congress, et al.) (Aug. 19, 2010).

Finally, no contributions were sent to OISM's address and there are no allegations otherwise. Accordingly, this claim holds no weight.

5. Respondents Used Their Best Efforts to Report Contributor Information

Notwithstanding the Democratic Party's claims, Respondents used their best efforts to obtain and report the occupation and employer information of their contributors.

The FECA requires a candidate committee to use its best efforts to obtain a contributor's full name, mailing address, occupation, and employer name. See 2 U.S.C. §§ 434(b)(3)(A), 431(13); 11 C.F.R. § 104.7(b)(1). To demonstrate "best efforts," the committee treasurer must: include on all written solicitations a clear request for the contributor's requisite information and an accurate statement of federal law regarding collection and reporting of this information; make at least one attempt to obtain any missing information within 30 days of receiving the contribution; and absent receiving complete information, the treasurer must disclose any information received regarding the contributor during the same two-year election cycle. Sec 11 C.F.R. §104.7(b). If the treasurer shows he used best efforts to obtain the information, any reparts submitted by the committee will be demand to comply with the Ast. Sec 2 U.S.C. § 432(i); accord sec 11 C.F.R. § 104.7.

Respondents earnestly sought to obtain the requisite information from contributors in order to comply with the best efforts requirement. For instance, Respondents included a clear

written request for contributor occupation and employer information as an attachment to their September 5, 2010 fundraising letter. The DPO's complaint does not include a legible copy of this written request (see Attrachment G, Complaint, MUR 6438 (Art Robitson for Congress) (Dec. 6, 2010)). Accordingly, Respondents have affixed a legible version of the request for contributor information hereto. See Exhibit 7.

Moreover, Respondents sent contributors who failed to supply occupation and employer information *not one but two* follow-up letters clearly requesting that the employment information be provided and returned in self-addressed, stamped envelopes. See Exhibit 8 (filed with the Commission in response to a request for additional information from the Reports Analysis Division).

This matter is similar to MUR 5957 (Committee to Elect Sekhon), where a novice candidate failed to report occupation and employer information for a significant number of contributors. Respondents should not be held liable for not reporting information its contributors refused to provide. As the Commission has noted, there are legitimate reasons a contributor will not provide employment information:

It is possible that some contributors simply do not believe it appropriate for the federal government to require the identification of their occupation or name of employer Some contributors are genuinely reluctant to answer the question, more out of a personal embarrassment or even "principle" than out of a desire, for example, to conneal embarrassing professional connections.

Statement of Reasons of Commissioners M. Petersen, C. Hunter & D. McGahn II, MURs 5957, 6031 at 8 (The Committee to Float Sekhon, et al.) (June 24, 2009) (conting Comments of Robert Bauer, Perkins Coie, Recordkeeping & Reporting by Political Committees: Best Efforts, 57 Fed. Reg. 44,137 (Sept. 24, 1992), at 4-5)). Hence, contributors are often skeptical of requests for employment information.

Contributors to the Robinson Campaign share Dr. Robinson's healthy skepticism of the reach and intrusiveness of the federal government. In fact, the Robinson Campaign received over 250 anarrymous contributious from individuals who wished to support his campaign without having to disabse their identities at all to the federal government.

Notwithstanding contributors' affirmative refusal to supply their occupation and employer information, the DPO claims that Respondents could have obtained missing contributor information by extracting information they may have provided when contributing to other candidates or groups. The FECA does not require a campaign to investigate its own contributors. Rather, it merely requires Respondents make one request for the missing information. See 11 C.F.R. § 104.7(b)(1). Respondents met and exceeded their burden. Accordingly, the Commission should take no further action. See Statement of Reasons of Commission of M. Petersen, C. Hunter & D. McGahn II, MURs 5957, 6031 at 11-12 (The Committee to Eleat Sekkon, et al.) (June 24, 2009) (disminsing allegations that the Hagan Committee violated FECA by failing to obtain and report occupation and employer information).

6. Respondents' Solicitations Satisfied the Act's Disclaimer Requirements

The Democratic Party boldly alleges that Respondents failed to adhere to the Act's sponsorship identification requirements in their relicitations. In fact, Respondents' made a good faith effort to ensure that all communications made it clear who paid for the message.

The Act requires candidates provide a disclaimer on all solicitations disseminated by mail, newspapers, magazines and other broadcasting mediums. 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a). This disclaimer requirement also applies to all email communications sent to more than 500 recipients. 11 C.F.R. § 110.11. The disclaimer must provide who paid for and authorized the communication. See 2 U.S.C. § 441d(a). If the communication was authorized and paid for by a candidate or candidate's committee, the communication must provide a statement to that effect.

Id. at § 441d(a)(1). The disclaimer, however, "need not appear on the front or cover page of the communication as long as it appears within the communication[.]" 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(c)(2)(iv).

Despite the DPO's claims, the May 2010 edition of Access to Energy conspicuously stated that Dr. Robinson paid the antire cost of the isanes that solicited contributions to the Robinson Campaign. This statement was positioned on the third page of the newsletter under the heading "Federal Election Laws." (See Attachment B, Complaint, MUR 6438 (Art Robinson for Congress) (Dec. 6, 2010)). The DPO simply sought to disregard it in an attempt to further its efforts to peddle a meritless complaint to the FEC. Hence, Respondents were in compliance with the regulations. See 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(c)(2)(iv).

Similarly, the September 5, 2010 solicitation letter to subscribers of Access to Energy also included a clear disclaimer on an attachment, which indicated that the mailing had been paid for by Art Rubinson for Congress. The DPO provided an itiegible copy of the attachment in its complaint. (See Attachment G, Complaint, MLIR 6438 (Art Robinson for Congress) (Dec. 6, 2010)). A legible copy is attached hereto as Exhibit 9. Accordingly, the September 5, 2010 solicitation letter complied with the Commission's disclaimer regulations. 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(c)(2)(iv).

A technical error was nesponsible for the abannes of the disclaimers on the amails sent to the Robinson Curriculum subscribers. Respondents drafted the correct language to be placed in the footer of each email, however, the individual who sent out the emails failed to transfer the statutory language. The Commission typically does not take action against respondents who have failed to natisfy disclaimer requirement because a statunical error was made in discomminating the communication or the disclaimer was missing in whole or in part.⁴

The Commission has routinely and repeatedly dismissed complaints where the defects in the disclaimer were unsubstantial. <u>See also</u> General Caussuel's Kepart, MUR 6265 (Genes); Mblk 1526 (hiswingery); MUR 5727 Kaloogian); MUR 5834 (Burner); MUR 6006 (Lunsford); MUR 6032 (Leatherwood); MUR 6042 (Roberts); MUR 6016 (Cae).

Nonetheless, it was obvious to the recipients that Respondents authorized and paid for the emails based on their content and the circumstances surrounding their dissemination. The Commission has held that the disclaimer requirement is met where it is clear to the public who is responsible for the particular communication. See MUR 6027 (Dole) (disclaimers sufficient to "indicate that the public would not have been misled as to who paid for the advertisement"); MUR 5775R (Pryce) ("it appears that viewers were apprised of the salient information"). Respondents' emails unequivocally communicated that they were paid for by the Robinson Campaign. For instance, eight of these emails were sent from the Treasurer's email address; the emails were signed by the Treasurer, Noah Robinson; the emails rallied public support for Dr. Robinson's campaign; the emails directed recipients to the campaign website for more information; and the emails stated that the mailing address was "Art Robinson for Congress, P.O. Box 1250, Cave Junution, OR 97523."

Furthermore, Dr. Robinson's March edition of Access to Energy contained sufficient identifying information to prevent the public from being misled as to who authorized and paid for the solicitation. The newsletter was written by Dr. Robinson and they identified him as the publisher and editor; Dr. Robinson identified himself as running for Congress and promoted the Robinson Campaign in the newsletter; Dr. Robinson requested any fundraising checks be addressed to "Art Robinson for Congress"; and the newsletter went to regular Access to Energy subscribers who were familiar with the nature of the newsletter. Thus, because it was clear Respondents authorized and paid for the solicitations, this matter does not warrant further investigation.

IV. CONCLUSION

For all of the reasons discussed above, the Commission should recognize the complaint filed by the Dæmocratic Party of Oregon for what it is – an attempt to intimidate a formidable candidate from running again against a long-term incumbent. Accordingly, the Commission should find that there is no reason to believe Respondents Art Robinson for Congress or Noah Robinson, as Treasurer, violated 2 U.S.C. §§ 434, 441a(a) or 441b and the Commission should exercise its prosecutorial discretion and take no further action against Respondents for any inadvertent violations of 2 U.S.C. § 441d.

Dear Mr. Holly,

This letter is in response to your letter of October 5th, 2010.

In this latter you ask that we clarify our precedures for establishing "Best Efforts" for information on contributors of \$200 or more. The required information includes, name, mailing address, accupation, and employer's name. In some instances, we do not have occupation and employer information, but we do have names and addresses for them — as we have reported to the FEC. Our contribution request forms ask for all required information, but occasionally our donors fall it fill it out, or send a contribution spontaneously that does not include all of it.

Our procedure has been to ask for the twising occupation and employer information in a penamed letter to each teditedual within his days of receiving the describes. Gen letter does NET ask for money and included with it is a return envelope. Many of our donors have supplied information is response to this letter.

A sample of the letter we have been using is shown in Exhibit A. Although it is simple, we do not see anything wrong with it and as far as we can see it is perfectly adequate. The envelope that goes with it is shown in Exhibit B.



Although we are only ingular nequired to nend one letter we felt that, in view of your concess, we should make this additional effort.

if you feel that anything in our procedure or follow up requests is inadequate, please inform us of what it is. It is our intention to completely satisfy the FEC legal reporting requirements.

Amended reports with any additional information will, of course, be filed soon.


