#### Full Board Meeting Minutes Wednesday, November 5, 2008 6 pm

The meeting was called to order at 6:10pm and Franc Perry, the Chair of Community Board 10 opened the meeting and welcomed everyone to the meeting. He also expressed his excitement about the presidential election results. Mr. Perry proceeded to open the floor for community speakers.

#### Public Announcements:

Gwenda Gatling, President of 210 West 146<sup>th</sup> Street Tenants Association voiced concern regarding the Ebrograph Housing Development Project located at 203-209 West 146<sup>th</sup> Street. She is requesting a response from HCCI on: the name of the independent asbestos removal contractor; a detailed description of the asbestos remediation plan; the location of the air monitoring system and when it will be setup; if daily air quality readings will be taken and if work practices will be mandated if trigger levels of Particulate Matter <10 microns or Total Suspended Particulate Lead reaches 80% of the figures that represent maximum acceptable levels; if the community will receive any written reports concerning the air quality limits; and when and how underground storage tanks be removed.

In addition the residents need to know their rodent abatement plan for the Ebrograph building which is infested with rats and their disposal plan for the 1930's through 1950 Black Cowboy movie films located in the building which has been closed since 1959. These old films contain celluloid which are highly flammable and can cause a danger to the community if not properly dealt with.

Fredrick Wilson, of 210 West 146<sup>th</sup> Street and former president of the Tenants Association, is requesting a response from HCCI regarding: the amount of asbestos-containing material that will be disturbed during the course of the project, will glove bag and/or test procedures be used for the project or will a piecemeal procedure be used where they will separate each asbestos contaminated area, clean it by washing it down and then remove the asbestos and then test again for asbestos and who will be monitoring it; how will the large boiler tanks surrounded by huge amounts of asbestos located in the underground location of the building be removed; will a detailed work procedure information report to the community before, during and after concerning their asbestos and demolition abatement activities be provided; will a detailed performance report relating to the Air and Bulk Sampling, Monitoring and analysis of their asbestos project so that we can compare the amounts of air contamination be given to the community to examine; and will a detailed and complete description of the Rodent Abatement Plan be provided.

Leon Tulton announced that there will be a series of workshops offered in Harlem by the NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, the PS 175 Parent Coordinator and the Saint Nicholas Housing Tenant Association for smokers and non-smokers.

- For smokers, a workshop will be held on November 10, 2008 at 6pm at PS 175/Promise Academy located at 175 West 134<sup>th</sup> Street in the Auditorium.

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- For non-smokers who may want to assist smokers in quitting, there will be two workshops: November 6 and 13<sup>th</sup> @ 5pm. The workshop will be located at St. Nicholas Houses, 225 West 129<sup>th</sup> Street, Apt. 1G. Flyers were distributed for all workshops.

Mr. Tulton also distributed Health Bucks which can be used to purchase produce from the farmers markets located throughout Central and East Harlem.

Alan Ornela made a presentation on life insurance.

Community Board Committee Calendar was discussed because the intergenerational committee is now scheduled to occur in the evening and due to this change, many community members have raised concerns. The committee has always operated in the morning to ensure all seniors could attend, but this time was not good for Board members due to work schedules. To accommodate all parties, there will now be two meetings monthly of the intergenerational committee, one meeting in the morning and one in the evening.

Rolando Garcia from Healthfirst reported that on November 6, 2008, there will be an opportunity for the community to come and learn about the Healthfirst Medicare Advantage Plans. The meeting will be held at the Salvation Army, 540 Lenox Avenue at 10 am. Mr. Garcia also announced that Healthfirst will host a holiday event at Madison Square Garden where grandparents who bring a child will receive a free toy.

WEACT will host a conference on climate change on January 29 & 30, 2009.

Conference of Minority Transportation NY Chapter Officials presented on the Workforce Development Program. The mission of this program is to provide critical support to assist youth throughout New York State to become successfully employed and to move towards self-sufficiency as they transition into adulthood. The program is geared to create an environment that will build various workforce skills and knowledge through mentoring, internship, apprenticeships, job shadowing, career exploration, on-the-job training, customized training, resume writing and interviewing skills.

Lamont Mays representing Inez Dickens reported the following actions taken by the Councilmember since our last meeting:

Councilmember Dickens is currently working on a number of Housing issues including: assisting with Tenant/Landlord issues; sign-on letter for DHCR regarding buildings coming out of Mitchell Lane and eviction proceedings; and funding for security cameras. She is also working with an Ethiopian Church who is facing eviction by HPD. Tenants held a press conference to air their concerns. She is also honoring Preston Washington with a Proclamation and an education wing will be dedicated in his honor.

Ms. Pierre reported on behalf of the Borough President's Office: The Borough President's office is now issuing applications for new Community Board members. Applications are due January 15, 2009. Upcoming events include a Food Conference in East Harlem. Robert Jackson

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reported that budget cuts are eminent and we can also anticipate approximately 3,000 job losses. We also foresee a cut of 180 million to the Department of Education next fiscal year.

Senator Perkins is in Albany and Cordell Claire reported on his behalf. She reported that Perkins joins in with the Harlem Community in celebrating the victory of Barack Obama and honoring/celebrating the life and work of Terence Tolbert. The NYS Senate now has a Democratic majority as a result of the recent election results. The NYS Budget has a severe deficit and cuts are eminent. Perkins will keep the community abreast of any activity regarding this issue. He is also looking for ideas on revenue generation and cost savings opportunities.

Gwen Black reported that the Harlem River Park is moving forward with its Arts Program. There is currently \$70,000 in funding available for community artists. They will also host their Annual Jazz Exhibit in the coming weeks.

A representative from the Violence Intervention Program (VIP) presented on the services provided by the agency. VIP is a Latino domestic violence organization that now has an outreach coordinator office in Harlem and is currently operating a hotline, community workshops, etc.

Juilius Tajiddin congratulated Temecca Anthony on her wedding. He also noted several early supporters of Barack Obama. He also raised concern about CB10 committee structure/attendance and the City Charter guidance. He underscored that the minutes do not accurately reflect what occurs in committee.

Samir Chatter announced that the Harlem clergy are working with black associations to develop block watch teams for 140<sup>th</sup> Street between 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Avenues. There will be a meeting on November 5, 2008 to discuss the development of the block watch team.

Dr. Samuel raised concern about the lights on 125<sup>th</sup> Street. She stated that the lights were paid for by UMES monies and no hearing occurred. She also distributed three handouts: Bring back black civic responsibility by Rock Hackshaw/Vote for Someone Who Cares by Lino Rios; a memorandum on street lamps for 125<sup>th</sup> Street dated March 21, 2006 and a Community Vote Tally Sheet. She urged the community to keep track of how community board members vote by keeping their tallies.

Assemblyman Fernell stated that the NYS budget is the focus of his work at this time. Education is also now vulnerable to cuts. Tax cuts, tax incentives, earned income tax credits are all being discussed as the State tries to manage over a billion dollar deficit. Fernell also discussed the bonus pool and how if bonuses are issued to Wall Street, NYS can tax these monies and the dollars can be used to reduce the Budget deficit. He also reported that Governor Paterson has asked Congressman Rangel for financial assistance for NYS.

Craig Schley thanked everyone for supporting him in his campaign against Charlie Dugan. He also reported that he received a good amount of votes even though his campaign ran for 2 months and cost \$6,000.


