Dear Mr. DiSano:

The Federal Election Commission considered your complaint received on March 20, 2012, but there were an insufficient number of votes to find reason to believe that Rick Santorum for President and Nadine Maenza in her official capacity as treasurer, the Michigan Faith & Freedom Coalition, and Glenn Clark violated the Federal Election Campaign Act (the "Act") and Commission regulations. Therefore, on May 21, 2013, the Commission closed its file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision will follow.

Because the file is now closed, documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Statement of Policy Regarding Disclosure of Closed Enforcement and Related Files, 68 Fed. Reg. 70,426 (Dec. 18, 2003); Statement of Policy Regarding Placing First General Counsel's Reports on the Public Record, 74 Fed. Reg. 66,132 (Dec. 14, 2009).

Finally, please note that the Act allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action by filing a petition with the United States District Court for the District of Columbia within 60 days. 2 U.S.C. § 437g(a)(8).
