Dear Mr. Binnall:

On June 30, 2016, you were notified that the Federal Election Commission found reason to believe that your clients, Designer Goldsmiths, Inc., and Dimitri Kesari, knowingly and willfully violated 52 U.S.C. § 30118. On March 26, 2019, you were notified that the Commission had determined to enter into pre-probable cause conciliation with Designer Goldsmiths, Inc., prior to a finding of probable cause to believe, and had determined to close the file with respect to Dimitri Kesari. After considering the circumstances of this matter, the Commission determined on January 11, 2022, to close the entire file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
