The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated March 27, 2014, but was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that the National Republican Congressional Committee and Keith Davis in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30102(e)(4) and 30124(b)(1) of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and 11 C.F.R. § 102.14. Accordingly, on March 19, 2019, the Commission closed the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
