On April 24, 2018, the Commission found reason to believe that Rep. Duncan D. Hunter, Margaret Hunter, and Duncan D. Hunter for Congress and Chris Marston in his official capacity as treasurer (the "Committee") violated 52 U.S.C. § 30114(b) by converting campaign funds to personal use and that the Committee violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b)(6)(A) by failing to accurately report disbursements.¹ The Commission notified each Respondent of its findings and commenced an investigation.

For these reasons, we believe it is prudent to hold the investigation in abeyance and seek tolling. Although neither Rep. Hunter nor Margaret Hunter has requested abeyance as of this date, if the Commission

approves this request, we intend to offer them a full abeyance in exchange for tolling.

RECOMMENDATION:

Hold the investigation in full abeyance until the conclusion of the Hunters' criminal trial, contingent upon each Respondent entering into an agreement to toll the statute of limitations for the duration of the abatement.
