Dear Mr. Centrich:

On May 8, 2018, you and your clients were notified that the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission") found reason to believe that HC4President and Kyle Prall in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30124(b)(1) and that Kyle Prall violated 52 U.S.C. § 30124(b)(2), by fraudulently soliciting contributions. On June 13, 2018, you submitted a response to the Commission's reason to believe findings.

After conducting an investigation and considering the circumstances of the matter, the Commission determined on June 25, 2020, to take no further action as to HC4President and Kyle Prall in his official and personal capacities and closed the file. The Commission admonishes your clients for apparent violations of 52 U.S.C. § 30124(b), which involved the same activity for which Mr. Prall pleaded guilty in federal court. Your clients should take steps to ensure that this activity does not occur in the future. The Commission has also instructed the Reports Analysis Division to administratively terminate HC4President.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
