GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

The Commission found reason to believe on 31 July 1978 and reasonable cause to believe on 2 August 1978 that respondents violated 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1) for failing to file 10 day pre-primary reports; the Commission also found reason to believe on 20 June 1978 and reasonable cause to believe on 9 August 1978 that respondents violated 2 U.S.C. §432(e)(1) and 11 CFR §101.2 for failing to file a statement of candidacy and designate a principal campaign committee. On 4 October 1978, the Commission determined to continue compliance with respondents William Bishop, Darrell Runyan, Robert Vines and Henry Belfor through conciliation. Proposed conciliation agreements were mailed on 6 October 1978.

II. DEVELOPMENTS

The conciliation agreements and letters of notification mailed to Mr. Runyan and Mr. Belfor were returned unsigned and unclaimed, while Mr. Bishop received notification on 18 October 1978 and Mr. Vines received notification on 13 October 1978. Mr. Bishop contacted the Reports Analysis Division on 19 October and was referred to the General Counsel's Office. The numerous

attempts made to contact Mr. Bishop have been unsuccessful as Mr. Bishop does not own a phone and relies on neighbors to give him phone messages. Mr. Vines has not contacted the Commission and attempts to contact him have been unsuccessful.

III. ANALYSIS

Pursuant to an amendment to the non-filer procedures adopted by the Commission on 26 October 1978, in cases where no financial activity data is unavailable, the Office of General Counsel recommends proceeding into conciliation only where the candidate wins the election or receives more than 30% of the vote. Therefore, as the four respondents fall within the purview of the amendment, and in accord with the amended non-filer procedures, the Office of General Counsel recommends taking no further action as to the four respondents.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

Take no further action as to William Bishop, Darrell Runyan, Henry Belfor and Robert Vines and close the file, subject to further review at the end of the year.

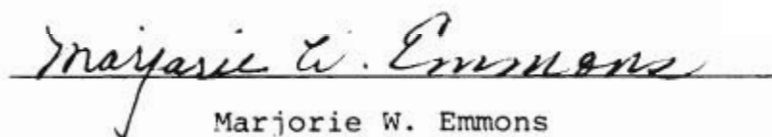

ADDENDUM TO GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Subsequent to the distribution to the Commission of the General Counsel's Report on 29 September 1978, the Reports Analysis division submitted additional information in reference to Respondent Committee to Elect Howell Smith ("the Committee"). On 10 September 1978, candidate Smith filed a 30 day post-primary and termination report covering the period 14 June 1978 through 8 August 1978. Although Mr. Smith filed this report as a candidate, Reports Analysis accepted it as a 10 day pre-primary and termination report for the Committee, upon condition that Mr. Smith make certain amendments to the report. (See attachment I).

In a letter attached to his report, Mr. Smith stated that prior to 14 June 1978, he received campaign contributions in the aggregate amount of \$925 in personal checks, and "deposited the checks to (his) checking account---listing them as campaign

contributions." (See attachment II). Mr. Smith designated the Committee to Elect Howell Smith as his principal campaign committee on 27 June 1978 when he filed a statement of candidacy and a reporting waiver. (See attachment III). These contributions were originally included in the Committee's 10 July quarterly report covering the period 1 April through 30 June.

11 CFR §101.3(a) prohibits commingling of political contributions with the candidates personal funds or accounts. All contributions conveyed by check must be consigned directly to the political committee and not cashed or redeemed by the candidate. Thus, it appears that Mr. Smith violated §101.3(a) when he deposited political contributions directly to his personal checking account. 1/

However, considering the amount of contributions, the fact that Mr. Smith entered campaign contribution deposits to his account separately from deposits of personal funds, the fact that the contributions were made before Mr. Smith designated a principal campaign committee, and the fact that Mr. Smith lost the election with 2.8% of the vote with limited financial activity, the General Counsel's office recommends that no

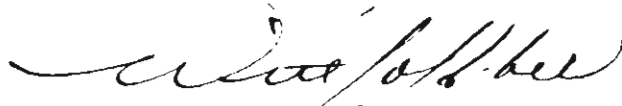
action be taken against Howell Smith.

I do not quite understand yet IF I AM TO FILE A REPORT IF ALL CONTRIBUTIONS AND EXPENDITURES WERE UNDER \$1000.

Knowing, of course, you are bound to seek a final report --- and actually, of course, too, I have nothing to hide --- I DECIDED TO GIVE THE GRAND TOTAL PICTURE. I APOLOGIZE FOR MYSELF AND FOR THE TWO LADIES INVOLVED --- AIMEE J. LEHR, CHAIRMAN, and BOBBY BAKER, TREAS. --- for any implication or commitment of delinquency.

Prior to the deadline, 14th JUNE 1978, I wrote a "feeler" letter to several friends. BANG! Back came a total of \$925 in personal checks made out to me --- and then, BANG, COMPLETE SILENCE! I deposited the checks to my CHECKING ACCOUNT --- listing them as CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS, NOT INCOME! On August 2, 1978, the Commission found reasonable cause to believe that you are in violation of 2 U.S.C. §434 for failing to file a 10 day pre-primary election report. Further on August 9, 1978 the Commission found reasonable cause to believe that you are in violation of 2 U.S.C. §432 (e)(1) and 11 CFR 101.2 for failing to file a statement of candidacy and designate a principal campaign committee.

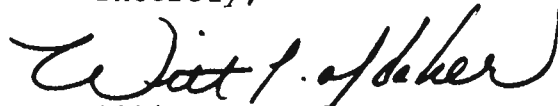

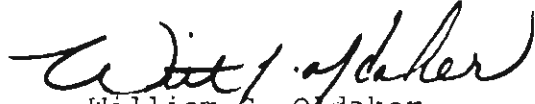

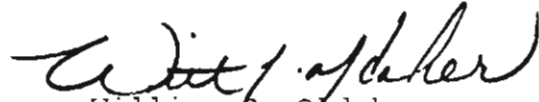

This matter has been initiated on the basis of information ascertained in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, an investigation has been conducted, and the Commission has found reasonable cause to believe that respondent, Henry Belfor, violated 2 U.S.C. §432 (e)(1) and 11 CFR §101.2 by failing to file a statement of candidacy and designate a principal campaign committee and 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i) by failing to file a 10 day pre-primary election report.

Now, therefore, the respective parties herein the Federal Election Commission and respondent Henry Belfor have duly entered into conciliation pursuant to §437g(a)(5)(A), do hereby agree as follows:

I. That the Federal Election Commission has jurisdiction over respondent and the subject of this proceeding.

VI. Respondent agrees that he will not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. §431, et seq.

GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

I. BACKGROUND

On August 25, 1978, Reports Analysis referred to the Office of General Counsel the names of five Georgia candidates and a committee which failed to file 10 day pre-primary election reports in violation of 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1). (See Attachment I). The reports were due July 29, 1978. Reason to believe notices were mailed on July 31, 1978, and reasonable cause to believe notices were mailed on August 2, 1978. On August 5, 1978, a list of those candidates and committees which failed to file the 10 day pre-primary reports was published.

Four of the five candidates referred for failure to file their pre-primary reports were also referred (MUR 720) by Reports Analysis on September 13, 1978 for failure to file a statement of candidacy and designate a principal campaign committee in violation of 2 U.S.C. §432(e)(1) and 11 CFR §101.2. (See attachment II). Informational notices were mailed on June 16, 1978, reason to believe notices were mailed on June 20, 1978 and reasonable cause to believe notices were mailed on August 9,

1978. As MUR 720 also concerns non-filer matters, MUR 720 and MUR 713 have been consolidated and further compliance actions against the four respondents will be continued through MUR 713.

II. ANALYSIS

A chart 1/ showing the names of the respondent candidates and committee, the district, the party, the number and percentage of votes, the reports filed and whether the reason to believe and reasonable cause to believe notifications were received is found in Attachment III. A discussion of the General Counsel's recommendations as to each respondent follows:

William "Bill" Bishop (1) and Darrell Runyan (2) were Democratic candidates in the primary election for the United States Senate. Both candidates received less than 5% of the vote. Neither candidate has filed a pre-primary report, a statement of candidacy nor designated a principal campaign committee. Therefore, the aggregate financial activity for the respondents cannot be determined at this time.

Bill Bishop has received notification that the Commission found reason to believe and reasonable cause to believe as to the 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1) violation and reason to believe as to the §432 (e)(1) and 11 CFR §101.2 violation. The reasonable cause to believe violation notice of §432 (e)(1) and 11 CFR §101.2 cannot be located. The reason to believe and reasonable cause to believe notices, for both violations sent to Mr. Darrell Runyan were returned unsigned. As Mr. Bishop and Mr. Runyan have not filed any reports and as the Commission has no indication of their financial activity, the General Counsel's

Office recommends that compliance action be continued through conciliation.

Henry Belfor (3), a Democratic candidate for the 5th Congressional District, and Robert Vines (4), the Republican candidate for the 5th District, lost the primary election for the United States House of Representatives. Henry Belfor received 2.8% of the vote, while Robert Vines received 10.5% of the vote. Neither candidate has filed a pre-primary report, a statement of candidacy, nor designated a principal campaign committee. Therefore, the aggregate financial activity of these respondents cannot be determined at this time. The reason to believe and reasonable cause to believe notices of the §434(a)(1) violation sent to Mr. Belfor were returned unsigned. He received the reason to believe and reasonable cause to believe notices of the §432(e)(1) and 11 CFR §101.2 violations. Mr. Vines received both reason to believe and reasonable cause to believe notices for his violations. As Mr. Belfor and Mr. Vines have not filed any reports and as the Commission has no indication of their financial activity, the General Counsel's Office recommends that compliance action be continued through conciliation.

William "Bill" Richard Connell (5), a Democratic candidate for the United States House of Representatives from the 2nd District lost the primary election. He received 23.3% of the votes. His quarterly report, covering the period 30 March 1978 through 30 June 1978 showed aggregate financial activity of \$4,522. Mr. Connell received both reason to believe and reasonable cause to believe notices of the §434(a)(1) violation. Commission records indicate that on August 7, 1978, a day before the primary election, Mr. Connell filed a 10 day pre-primary report, indicating aggregate receipts

and expenditures of less than \$1,000. 2/ It is noted that the Bill Connell Campaign Committee filed a timely 10 day pre-primary report showing aggregate financial activity of less than \$5,000. As Mr. Connell lost the election and as his Committee filed a timely report, the Office of General Counsel recommends no further action.

The Committee to Elect Howell Smith (6) is the principal campaign committee of Howell H.E. Smith, an unsuccessful Democratic candidate in the primary election for the U.S. Senate, who received 2.8% of the vote. The Committee has not filed a pre-primary report. The respondent Committee submitted 3A postcards for their quarterly reports, indicating aggregate financial activity of less than \$1,000. The reason to believe notice of the §434(a)(1) violation sent to the Committee, was returned unsigned, while the reasonable cause to believe notice cannot be located. As Mr. Smith lost the election, and as the Committee's previous reports show minimal financial activity, the Office of General Counsel recommends no further action.

III. RECOMMENDATION

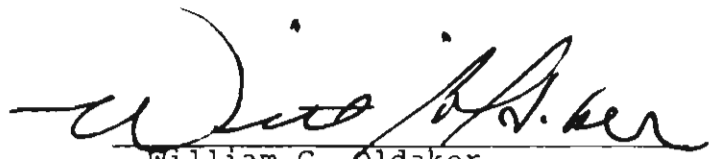
1. The General Counsel's office recommends no further action be taken against respondents William Richard Connell and the Committee to Elect Howell Smith, and the file closed.

This letter is prompted by the Federal Election Commission's interest in helping candidates comply with the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

It has come to the attention of the Commission that you have filed with the appropriate state officer to run for Federal office. The Federal Election Campaign Act defines a "candidate" as an individual who has taken the action necessary under the law of a State to qualify for nomination for election or election to Federal office. Thus, you appear to be a candidate under the Act.

All candidates are required to file a statement of candidacy and designate a principal campaign committee (FEC Form 2), to file a statement of organization for that committee (FEC Form 1), and to file reports of receipts and expenditures with the Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the House, or the Commission, as appropriate.

If you have not complied with these requirements, you should do so immediately.

Copies of FEC Forms 1 and 2 to register yourself and your principal campaign committee are enclosed. A package of materials to explain the requirements of the law and forms to be used for reporting is being mailed to you under separate cover.

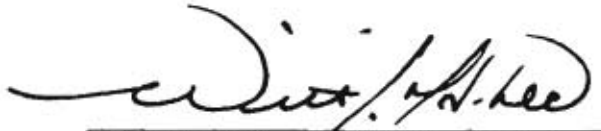

Nunn Wins Easily:

McDonald Forced Into Runoff in Georgia 7th

Rep. Larry P. McDonald, the far-right scourge of the Georgia Democratic establishment, trailed primary opponent Smith Foster in voting Aug. 8 and faces a difficult runoff against him Aug. '89.

McDonald's strident style and Birch Society membership have alienated moderate Georgia Democrats since his election in 1974, but it took Foster's carpet fortune to mount a campaign strong enough to threaten his seat. Nearly complete returns gave the 45-year-old Foster 33,806 votes to 32,889 for McDonald.

In other voting, Georgia Democrats easily renominated Sen. Sam Nunn and Gov. George Busbee for second terms. Returns from the open 6th District set up a runoff between state Sen. Virginia Shapard and state Sen. Peter Banks. Shapard held a wide lead over Banks and an even wider one over the most controversial candidate in the primary, Betty Talmadge, former wife of U.S. Sen. Herman E. Talmadge, D-Ga. Betty Talmadge drew national publicity but only 17 percent of the vote, leaving her far short of a runoff spot against Shapard and Banks.

The major news of the day, however, came out of McDonald's 7th District. Although Foster had never run for office before, he successfully courted support from diverse anti-McDonald elements in the district, including organized labor and the League of Conservation Voters. This complemented his lavish, personally financed media campaign.

Foster lost populous Cobb County (Marietta and northwestern Atlanta suburbs), McDonald's home base, by 1,800 votes, but captured McDonald strongholds in the mountainous central part of the district. Foster carried Floyd County (Rome) as well as several of the smaller counties around it.

During the primary campaign Foster accused McDonald of being an ineffective extremist who labeled himself a fiscal conservative while filling the *Congressional Record* with inserts that wasted taxpayers' money. McDonald countered that Foster was a product of the labor bosses who were trying to buy the seat.

In the runoff, McDonald will have to pick up a significant share of the vote cast for Marietta engineer Ken Butterworth, the third place finisher in the primary. That may not be easy: Butterworth ran as the major anti-McDonald candidate in 1976 and just missed forcing a runoff then.

Talmadge Fails

In the 6th District, Betty Talmadge was banking on her name familiarity and the claim that she could exert more influence in Washington than any of her rivals. But Shapard, a New York native and wife of a Griffin textile manufacturer, outspent her opponents and mounted an aggressive, well-organized campaign that nearly won a majority.

Shapard ran ahead by rolling up a large lead in the counties of her state Senate district, Clayton and Spalding being the most populous. She also won easily in suburban Fulton County, in the Atlanta area, where about one-quarter of the primary vote was cast. Banks won elsewhere.

Talmadge finished third in nearly all the 14 counties of the district, although she was second in the Fulton County precincts.

Banks and Shapard both have progressive reputations in the state Senate, promoting passage of the Equal Rights Amendment. But both stressed conservative positions in this year's House campaign. The winner of the runoff will contest the general election against Newt Gingrich, the former geography professor who will be the Republican nominee for the third time in a row.

Gingrich will be a formidable opponent. He came within 6,000 votes of Democratic Rep. John Flynt in 1974, then cut the margin to 2,774 against him two years later. Some Georgia Democrats feel the prospect of another campaign against Gingrich helped persuade Flynt to announce his retirement this year.

The statewide contests went as expected. Nunn, like Republican Sen. Howard H. Baker Jr. in Tennessee, was confronted by a large but weak field of challengers who tried to capitalize on his support for the Panama Canal treaties. Underfinanced and with low name identification, they made little impact. Nunn will face lightly-regarded Republican John W. Stokes this fall.

Busbee's victory was nearly as overwhelming. Flamboyant state Sen. Roscoe Dean carried several counties around his home base in southeastern Georgia, but elsewhere the popular Busbee ran well ahead. He will face Republican state chairman Rodney M. Cook, the easy GOP primary winner, in the general election.
