Dear Mr. Toner:

On May 4, 2017, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, 58th Presidential Inaugural Committee (“PIC”), Sara Armstrong in her official capacity as Chief Executive Officer of PIC, and Doug Ammerman in his official capacity as Designated Officer of PIC, of a complaint alleging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and 11 C.F.R. § 110.20(j) of the Commission’s regulations.

On February 25, 2021, the Commission considered the complaint but there was an insufficient number of votes to find reason to believe 58th Presidential Inaugural Committee (“PIC”), Sara Armstrong in her official capacity as Chief Executive Officer of PIC, and Doug Ammerman in his official capacity as Designated Officer of PIC, violated 11 C.F.R. § 110.20(j). Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission’s decision will follow.
