Dear Messrs. Elias and Wilson:

On August 1, 2019, your client, the Democratic National Committee and Virginia McGregor in her official capacity as treasurer, was notified that the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission") found reason to believe that it violated 52 U.S.C. § 30121(a)(2) of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and 11 C.F.R. § 110.20(g) of the Commission's regulations.

On April 8, 2021, the Commission considered the General Counsel's and your client's briefs and found no probable cause to believe that your client violated 52 U.S.C. § 30121(a)(2) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.20(g). Accordingly, the Commission closed the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision will follow.
