> MUR 7283 - Response of Josh Welle for Congress and Jada Kavanagh, in her capacity as Treasurer, & Mr. Josh Welle

Dear Ms. Stevenson:

This response is submitted on behalf of the above-referenced respondents in relation to the October 11, 2017, letter from the Commission notifying Josh Welle for Congress (the "Campaign") and Mr. Welle of a complaint filed by Mr. Mike Keeling, designated by the Commission as MUR 7283.1

Josh Welle declared his candidacy publicly on September 21, 2017, but it was not until six days later, on September 27, 2017, that Mr. Welle became a "candidate" under the Commission's definition when his campaign activity exceeded \$5,000, thus triggering FEC registration and reporting responsibilities.²

Ten days after becoming a candidate, on October 7, 2017, Mr. Welle timely filed his Statement of Candidacy on FEC Form 2.³ And 10 days after that, on October 17, 2017, the Committee timely filed its FEC Form 1 Statement of Organization.⁴

Accordingly, the Committee is in full compliance with the Commission's registration requirements and therefore, pursuant to 52 U.S.C. § 30109, this matter should be dismissed.⁵
