CERTIFICATION

I, Vicktoria J. Allen, recording secretary of the Federal Election Commission executive session, do hereby certify that on July 15, 2021, the Commission took the following actions in the above-captioned matter:

1. Failed by a vote of 3-3 to:
 - a. Find reason to believe that Jennifer Wexton and Wexton for State Senate violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1)(B).
 - b. Find reason to believe that Wexton for State Senate and Wexton for Congress and Joan Kowalski in her official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1)(A) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(d).
 - c. Approve the Factual and Legal Analysis, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated October 31, 2018.
 - d. Authorize pre-probable cause conciliation with Jennifer Wexton, Wexton for State Senate, and Wexton for Congress and Joan Kowalski in her official capacity as treasurer.
 - e. Approve the proposed conciliation agreement, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated October 31, 2018.
 - f. Approve the appropriate letters.

Commissioners Broussard, Walther, and Weintraub voted affirmatively for the motion.

Commissioners Cooksey, Dickerson, and Trainor dissented.

2. Failed by a vote of 3-3 to:

- a. Find no reason to believe that Jennifer Wexton and Wexton for State Senate violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1)(B).
- b. Find reason to believe that Wexton for State Senate and Wexton for Congress and Joan Kowalski in her official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1)(A) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(d).
- c. Direct the Office of General Counsel to draft a corresponding Factual and Legal Analysis.
- d. Authorize the Office of General Counsel to enter into pre-probable cause conciliation.
- e. Direct the Office of General Counsel to draft appropriate pre-probable cause conciliation agreement.
- f. Approve the appropriate letters.

Commissioners Cooksey, Dickerson, and Trainor voted affirmatively for the motion.

Commissioners Broussard, Walther, and Weintraub dissented.

3. Decided by a vote of 6-0 to:

- a. Closed the file.
- b. Issue appropriate letters.
