The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in the complaint submitted by the Republican Party of Virginia on December 5, 2017 but was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that Jennifer Wexton and Wexton for State Senate violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1)(B) and that Wexton for State Senate and Wexton for Congress and Joan Kowalski in her official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1)(A) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(d). Accordingly, on July 15, 2021, the Commission closed the file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
