Dear Mr. Deutsch:

On December 7, 2017, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, Jennifer Wexton, Wexton for Congress and Joan Kowalski in her official capacity as treasurer, and Wexton for State Senate, of a complaint alleging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

On July 15, 2021, the Commission considered the complaint but was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that Jennifer Wexton and Wexton for State Senate violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1)(B) and that Wexton for State Senate and Wexton for Congress and Joan Kowalski in her official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1)(A) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.3(d). Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
