DISMISSAL AND CASE CLOSURE UNDER THE ENFORCEMENT PRIORITY SYSTEM

## **GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT**

15 Under the Enforcement Priority System, the Commission uses formal scoring criteria as a 16 basis to allocate its resources and decide which matters to pursue. These criteria include, without 17 limitation, an assessment of the following factors: (1) the gravity of the alleged violation, taking into 18 account both the type of activity and the amount in violation; (2) the apparent impact the alleged 19 violation may have had on the electoral process; (3) the complexity of the legal issues raised in the 20 matter; and (4) recent trends in potential violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as 21 amended (the "Act"), and developments of the law. It is the Commission's policy that pursuing 22 relatively low-rated matters on the Enforcement docket warrants the exercise of its prosecutorial 23 discretion to dismiss cases under certain circumstances. 24 The Office of General Counsel has scored MUR 7311 as a low-rated matter and has 25 determined that it should not be referred to the Alternative Dispute Resolution Office.<sup>1</sup> For the

- reasons set forth below, we recommend that the Commission dismiss the allegations that David

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1 Gevry for President 2020 and Christopher Savage in his official capacity as treasurer, and David

2 Christopher Gevry<sup>2</sup> violated the Act or Commission regulations.

The Complainant alleges that the Respondents fraudulently used his address on their

4 Statements of Candidacy and Organization.<sup>3</sup> Respondents did not respond to the Reports Analysis

5 Division's ("RAD") Requests for Additional Information.<sup>4</sup> As a result, RAD removed Respondents'

6 filings from the Commission's searchable candidate/committee filings database and placed them in

7 the unverified filings database.

Within fifteen days of becoming a candidate,<sup>5</sup> the candidate must designate a principal

9 campaign committee by filing a Statement of Candidacy ("FEC Form 2") that includes, among other

10 things, the individual's address and his or her principal campaign committee's name and address.<sup>6</sup>

11 The principal campaign committee must then file a Statement of Organization ("FEC Form 1") no

12 later than ten days after designation by the candidate that includes, among other things, the

13 committee's address.<sup>7</sup>

14 Given that the FEC Forms 1 and 2 have been removed from the Commission's searchable

15 candidate/committee filings database, we recommend that the Commission dismiss the allegations

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

Gevry for President 2020 and Christopher Savage in his official capacity as treasurer, and David Christopher Gevry violated the Act and Commission regulations, pursuant to the Commission's prosecutorial discretion under *Heckler v. Chaney*, 470 U.S. 821 (1985);

2. Approve the attached Factual and Legal Analysis and the appropriate letters; and

3. Close the file as to all respondents.
