The Federal Election Commission (“Commission”) has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated February 14, 2018, along with the supplemental information that you submitted on February 20, 2018, and March 13, 2018, but there were an insufficient number of votes to find reason to believe that the respondents violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the “Act”). Accordingly, on March 23, 2021, the Commission closed the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission’s decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
