Dear Mr. Cohen:

On February 27, 2018, March 1, 2018, April 19, 2018, April 20, 2018, May 10, 2018, August 9, 2018, and May 17, 2019, the Federal Election Commission (“Commission”) notified you of four complaints, and their related amendments, alleging that you violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the “Act”) and the Commission’s regulations. The Commission considered the allegations raised in the complaints and there were an insufficient number of votes to find reason to believe you may have violated the Act and Commission regulations as alleged. A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission’s decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
