Dear Mr. Woodhouse:

The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated February 26, 2018, but was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe Utah Love PAC, formerly known as Friends of Mia Love, and Robert Carlin in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b) and 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f), to take no action at this time as to Mia Love, and to find reason to believe that Utah Republican Party and Mike Bird in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b)(4) and (8), 52 U.S.C. § 30116(a)(2)(A), and 52 U.S.C. § 30120(a)(2). The Commission was also equally divided on dismissing the allegations in this matter. Accordingly, on August 31, 2021, the Commission voted to close the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
