Dear Messrs. Wang and Goodman:

On August 13, 2019, we notified your clients, Conservative Leadership for Arizona and Tim Sifert in his official capacity as treasurer ("Committee"), that there is reason to believe that the Committee violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1)(A), a provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. We sent the Committee a copy of the Factual and Legal Analysis, which formed the basis for the Commission's findings, and a Request for Written Answers and Production of Documents. On October 16, 2019, we received your response on behalf of the Committee to the Commission's reason to believe finding including a request that the Commission enter into pre-probable cause conciliation.

On March 9, 2021, the Commission determined to enter into pre-probable cause conciliation and approved a conciliation agreement for the Committee

The conciliation agreement is enclosed. The Commission has authorized the Office of General Counsel to engage in pre-probable cause conciliation with the Committee from the date of your receipt of the enclosed agreement for a period not to exceed 21 days, or 3 months if there is a tolling agreement in place to extend the statute of limitations for an additional 90 days. I have enclosed a tolling agreement to extend the statute of limitations for an additional 90 days that you may sign on behalf of the Committee and return to us.
