Dear Mr. Reese:

On March 7, 2018, the Federal Election Commission found reason to believe that your client, Highway 31 and Edward Still in his official capacity as treasurer (the “Committee”), violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b)(3)(A) of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (“the Act”) and authorized an investigation. On October 11, 2019, your client submitted a response to the Commission’s reason to believe finding. After considering the circumstances of the matter, the Commission determined on September 2, 2021, to take no further action as to the Committee, and closed the file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016. A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission’s decision will follow.
