Dear Mr. Werbrock:

On August 1, 2019, you were notified that the Federal Election Commission found reason to believe that your clients, End Citizens United and its treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. § 30120(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(b) and you were provided the Factual and Legal Analysis explaining the Commission's decision On September 5, 2019, you submitted a response on behalf of End Citizens United to the Commission's reason to believe finding.

After considering the circumstances of the matter, the Commission determined on March 25, 2021, as a matter of prosecutorial discretion, to dismiss this matter as to End Citizens United and close the file. A Statement of Reasons further explaining the basis for the Commission's decision will follow.
