Heller for Senate and Chrissie Hastie in her official capacity as treasurer

Dear Messrs. Gober and McCurry:

On March 30, 2018, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, Heller for Senate and Chrissie Hastie in her official capacity as treasurer, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. On September 22, 2022, the Commission found, on the basis of the information in the complaint, information provided by your clients, and information from an investigation conducted by the Commission, that there is no reason to believe Heller for Senate and Chrissie Hastie in her official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30118(a), 52 U.S.C. § 30120(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.11. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
