On May 31, 2018, the Federal Election Commission (“Commission”) notified your clients Heller for Senate and Chrissie Hastie in her official capacity as treasurer, and Heller Enterprises, LLC, of a complaint alleging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and the Commission’s regulations. The Commission has considered the allegations raised in the complaint and determined to dismiss those allegations. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter on March 23, 2021. A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission’s decision will follow.
