Dear Mr. Crosland:

On June 11, 2018, the Federal Election Commission notified your firm of allegations against your clients, Donald Trump and Donald J. Trump for President, Inc. and Bradley T. Crate in his official capacity as treasurer, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended ("the Act"). A copy of the complaint was forwarded to your firm at that time.

On July 11, 2019, the Commission voted to dismiss the allegations that your clients violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30116 and 30118 and 11 C.F.R. § 109.21 by making and accepting prohibited contributions in the form of coordinated communications or expenditures. On July 18, 2019, we notified your firm of the Commission's vote and enclosed the Factual and Legal Analyses, which more fully explained the Commission's decision. We further informed your firm that the case remained open as to other respondents and that the confidentiality provisions of 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(12)(A) remained in effect.

On April 28, 2022, the Commission voted to close the file as to all respondents in this matter. Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
