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21 **SUBJECT:** MURs 7409 and 7620 (Mason Tenders District Council of Greater New York and
22 LI PAC) - Pre-Probable Cause Conciliation Agreement
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25 On June 20, 2019, the Commission found reason to believe in MUR 7620 that Mason
26 Tenders District Council of Greater New York and LI PAC and Mike Prohaska in his official
27 capacity as treasurer ("Committee") violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b) by reporting \$170,773.73 in
28 increased activity on its amended 2018 12-Day Pre-General Report.¹ The Commission
29 authorized pre-probable cause conciliation with the Committee in MUR 7620 and approved
30 a conciliation agreement addressing both the violation in MUR 7620 as well as a similar
31 violation in MUR 7409 and a combined opening settlement offer Attached is a
32 negotiated conciliation agreement that has been signed by the treasurer of the Committee that
33 would resolve the violations.³

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We believe that this negotiated settlement represents an acceptable resolution of these matters. We therefore recommend that the Commission accept the signed conciliation agreement with the Committee and close the file.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Accept the attached conciliation agreement in MURs 7409 and 7620 with Mason Tenders District Council of Greater New York and LI PAC and Mike Prohaska in his official capacity as treasurer;
2. Approve the appropriate letter; and
3. Close the file.

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
