Dear Mr. Monsees:

On July 9, 2018, the Federal Election Commission (“Commission”) notified you of a complaint alleging that LG PAC and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the “Act”). A copy of the complaint was provided at that time. On August 15, 2018, and November 29, 2018, we notified you that the Commission had received additional information pertaining to the allegations and provided a copy of that additional information.

On June 25, 2020, the Commission considered the complaint but was equally divided on whether to dismiss the allegations on the grounds of prosecutorial discretion based on *Hecker v. Chaney*. In addition, there was an insufficient number of votes to find reason to believe that LG PAC and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30104(b), 30122. On January 14, 2021, the Commission again considered the complaint but was equally divided on whether to dismiss the allegations on the grounds of prosecutorial discretion based on *Hecker v. Chaney*, and whether to find reason to believe that LG PAC and you, in your official capacity as treasurer, violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30104(b), 30122. Accordingly, on June 7, 2022, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters*, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016. A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission’s decision will follow.
