Dear Mr. Kuehne:

On June 21, 2019, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, the Jacobs Law Group and Russell S. Jacobs, of a complaint alleging that your clients had violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

On May 24, 2022, the Commission considered the matter but was equally divided on whether to dismiss the allegations as a matter of prosecutorial discretion. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016. One or more Statements of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision will follow.
