General Counsel's Report

Background

On September 29, 1978, the Non-Filer Coordinator referred the Win With Bradford Committee (Committee) to the Office of General Counsel for failing to file its 10-Day Pre-Primary Election Report in a timely fashion, in violation of 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1). The report was due on September 2, 1978. (Election held on September 12, 1978). The reason to believe notice was sent on September 4, 1978 and the reasonable cause to believe notice was sent on September 6, 1978. The Committee's name was published on a list, as a 10-Day Pre-Primary non-filer.

On September 11, 1978, the 10 Day Pre-Primary Report of the Committee was received.

Since Bradford received 45% of the vote, the Commission, on October 26, 1978, determined that compliance action should be taken and approved the General Counsel's proposed conciliation agreement.

The agreement was sent on October 27, 1978, but was returned. A second letter was sent on November 29, 1978.

On December 28, 1978, Office of General Counsel staff discussed the situation with Mr. Ray Fenster, of the Committee. Mr. Fenster

stated that although the Commission received the report late, it had been mailed on August 31, 1978.

A clerk with the Office of Records and Registration of the House of Representatives indicated that the report had been postmarked on August 31, 1978, but had not been received until September 11, 1978.


Analysis

In light of the fact that the report was filed late because it took twelve days for the Postal Service to deliver it, it is recommended that the case be closed.

Recommendation

Close the file.


INTERIM CONCILIATION REPORT

Dear Ms. Bradford:

On September 6, 1978, the Commission found reasonable cause to believe that your committee, the Win With Bradford Committee, is in violation of 2 U.S.C. §434 for filing its 10 Day Pre-Primary Election Report late.

The Commission has a duty to attempt to correct such violations for a period of 30 days by informal methods of conference, conciliation and persuasion, and by entering into a conciliation agreement. 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(5)(A). If we are unable to reach an agreement during that period, the Commission may institute civil suit in the United States District Court and seek payment of a civil penalty not in excess of \$5,000.

We enclose a proposed conciliation agreement that this office is prepared to recommend to the Commission in settlement of this matter.

On September 29, 1978, the Non-Filer Coordinator referred the Win With Bradford Committee (Committee) to the Office of General Counsel for failing to file its 10-Day Pre-Primary Election Report in a timely fashion, in violation of 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1). The report was due on September 2, 1978. (Election held on September 12, 1978). The reason to believe notice was sent on September 4, 1978 and the reasonable cause to believe notice was sent on September 6, 1978. The Committee's name was published on a list, as a 10-Day Pre-Primary non-filer.

On September 11, 1978, the Committee filed its 10-Day Pre-Primary report.

Analysis

Although the candidate, Naomi Bradford, lost the election, she received 45% of the vote and had aggregate contributions and expenditures of over \$13,000. It is therefore recommended that compliance action be continued through the conciliation process.

Strickland, Armstrong Win:

Right vs. Right in Colorado

Conservatives battled conservatives in Colorado Republican voting Sept. 12, with the more militant faction winning a key statewide victory but suffering setbacks in congressional contests.

Backed by Ronald Reagan's Colorado coordinator and the state's most vocal conservatives, state Sen. Ted Strickland defeated state Senate majority leader Dick Plock for the Republican gubernatorial nomination. The result was a duplication of the July state convention, in which the well-organized Strickland ran ahead of Plock to earn top spot on the primary ballot.

Plock was backed by former Gov. John A. Love and much of the GOP establishment. But a decision by Denver television stations to limit political advertising crippled Plock's plan to launch a late media drive. Strickland carried all the major population centers except Denver, Plock's home base. He will face Democratic Gov. Richard D. Lamm, who had no primary opposition.

Another favorite of Colorado conservatives, Rep. William L. Armstrong, overwhelmed political newcomer Jack Swigert for the Republican Senate nomination. Armstrong had disappointed some conservatives by favoring the nomination of President Ford in 1976, but he won support from a wide variety of right-wing groups as well as from state

Republican officials who felt it was the veteran congressman's turn to run for the Senate.

Militant conservatives had trouble in House races. Two John Birch Society members — Idaho Springs real estate agent Dick Davis and Durango accountant Cecil Cooper — both lost badly in Republican House campaigns.

Davis lost by nearly a 2-1 margin in his effort to oust Republican Rep. James P. (Jim) Johnson in the 4th District. Davis, who mounted an independent campaign against Johnson two years ago, claimed the incumbent was too liberal for his constituency.

Cooper fared no better in his race for the 3rd District nomination. His first place finish this summer in the district convention won him top line on the ballot, but he finished a distant third in the primary. The winner, state Sen. Harold L. McCormick, rolled up most of his lead around his home town of Canon City and populous Colorado Springs.

McCormick will oppose Democratic primary winner Ray Kogovsek, the minority leader of the state Senate, for the seat being vacated by retiring Democratic Rep. Frank E. Evans.

Two state representatives battled to out-conservative each other and win the Republican nomination to succeed Armstrong in the 5th District. The most ardent one, Ken Kramer, won at the conclusion of a bitter campaign against Bob Eckelberry. Both candidates claimed their voting records had been distorted by the other, and a representative from the Republican National Committee was sent into cool both sides down.





Strickland, Armstrong Win:

Right vs. Right in Colorado

Conservatives battled conservatives in Colorado Republican voting Sept. 12, with the more militant faction winning a key statewide victory but suffering setbacks in congressional contests.

Backed by Ronald Reagan's Colorado coordinator and the state's most vocal conservatives, state Sen. Ted Strickland defeated state Senate majority leader Dick Plock for the Republican gubernatorial nomination. The result was a duplication of the July state convention, in which the well-organized Strickland ran ahead of Plock to earn top spot on the primary ballot.

Plock was backed by former Gov. John A. Love and much of the GOP establishment. But a decision by Denver television stations to limit political advertising crippled Plock's plan to launch a late media drive. Strickland carried all the major population centers except Denver, Plock's home base. He will face Democratic Gov. Richard D. Lamm, who had no primary opposition.

Another favorite of Colorado conservatives, Rep. William L. Armstrong, overwhelmed political newcomer Jack Swigert for the Republican Senate nomination. Armstrong had disappointed some conservatives by favoring the nomination of President Ford in 1976, but he won support from a wide variety of right-wing groups as well as from state

Republican officials who felt it was the veteran congressman's turn to run for the Senate.

Militant conservatives had trouble in House races. Two John Birch Society members — Idaho Springs real estate agent Dick Davis and Durango accountant Cecil Cooper — both lost badly in Republican House campaigns.

Davis lost by nearly a 2-1 margin in his effort to oust Republican Rep. James P. (Jim) Johnson in the 4th District. Davis, who mounted an independent campaign against Johnson two years ago, claimed the incumbent was too liberal for his constituency.

Cooper fared no better in his race for the 3rd District nomination. His first place finish this summer in the district convention won him top line on the ballot, but he finished a distant third in the primary. The winner, state Sen. Harold L. McCormick, rolled up most of his lead around his home town of Canon City and populous Colorado Springs.

McCormick will oppose Democratic primary winner Ray Kogovsek, the minority leader of the state Senate, for the seat being vacated by retiring Democratic Rep. Frank E. Evans.

Two state representatives battled to out-conservative each other and win the Republican nomination to succeed Armstrong in the 5th District. The most ardent one, Ken Kramer, won at the conclusion of a bitter campaign against Bob Eckelberry. Both candidates claimed their voting records had been distorted by the other, and a representative from the Republican National Committee was sent into cool both sides down.





- I. That the Federal Election Commission has jurisdiction over respondent and the subject of this proceeding.
- II. That respondent Committee has had a reasonable opportunity to demonstrate that no action should be taken in this matter.
- III. That the pertinent facts in this matter are as follows:
That the Committee, as of September 2, 1978, had failed to file its 10 Day Pre-Primary Report; the report was filed on September 11, 1978, thereby making the report nine (9) days late;

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THEREFORE, respondent Committee agrees:

- I. Respondent's action in failing to file its 10 Day Pre-Primary Election Report on September 2, 1978, was in violation of 2 U.S.C. §434(a)(1)(A)(i).
- II. That it will pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$250 pursuant to 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(6)(B)(i).
- III. Respondent agrees that it will not undertake any activity which is in violation of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, 2 U.S.C. §431, et seq.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- I. The Commission, on the request of anyone filing a complaint under 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(1) concerning the matters at issue herein, or on its own motion, may review compliance with this agreement. If the Commission believes that this agreement or any requirement thereof has been violated, it may institute civil action for relief in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia.
- II. It is mutually agreed that this agreement shall become effective as of the date that all parties hereto have executed same and the Commission has approved the entire agreement.

On September 6, 1978, the Commission found reasonable cause to believe that your committee, the Win With Bradford Committee, is in violation of 2 U.S.C. §434 for filing its 10 Day Pre-Primary Election Report late.

The Commission has a duty to attempt to correct such violations for a period of 30 days by informal methods of conference, conciliation and persuasion, and by entering into a conciliation agreement. 2 U.S.C. §437g(a)(5)(A). If we are unable to reach an agreement during that period, the Commission may institute civil suit in the United States District Court and seek payment of a civil penalty not in excess of \$5,000.

We enclose a proposed conciliation agreement that this office is prepared to recommend to the Commission in settlement of this matter.

If you agree with the provisions of the enclosed conciliation agreement, please sign and return it along with the civil penalty, to the Commission within ten days. I will then recommend that the Commission approve the agreement.

Strickland, Armstrong Win:

Right vs. Right in Colorado

Conservatives battled conservatives in Colorado Republican voting Sept. 12, with the more militant faction winning a key statewide victory but suffering setbacks in congressional contests.

Backed by Ronald Reagan's Colorado coordinator and the state's most vocal conservatives, state Sen. Ted Strickland defeated state Senate majority leader Dick Plock for the Republican gubernatorial nomination. The result was a duplication of the July state convention, in which the well-organized Strickland ran ahead of Plock to earn top spot on the primary ballot.

Plock was backed by former Gov. John A. Love and much of the GOP establishment. But a decision by Denver television stations to limit political advertising crippled Plock's plan to launch a late media drive. Strickland carried all the major population centers except Denver, Plock's home base. He will face Democratic Gov. Richard D. Lamm, who had no primary opposition.

Another favorite of Colorado conservatives, Rep. William L. Armstrong, overwhelmed political newcomer Jack Swigert for the Republican Senate nomination. Armstrong had disappointed some conservatives by favoring the nomination of President Ford in 1976, but he won support from a wide variety of right-wing groups as well as from state

Republican officials who felt it was the veteran congressman's turn to run for the Senate.

Militant conservatives had trouble in House races. Two John Birch Society members — Idaho Springs real estate agent Dick Davis and Durango accountant Cecil Cooper — both lost badly in Republican House campaigns.

Davis lost by nearly a 2-1 margin in his effort to oust Republican Rep. James P. (Jim) Johnson in the 4th District. Davis, who mounted an independent campaign against Johnson two years ago, claimed the incumbent was too liberal for his constituency.

Cooper fared no better in his race for the 3rd District nomination. His first place finish this summer in the district convention won him top line on the ballot, but he finished a distant third in the primary. The winner, state Sen. Harold L. McCormick, rolled up most of his lead around his home town of Canon City and populous Colorado Springs.

McCormick will oppose Democratic primary winner Ray Kogovsek, the minority leader of the state Senate, for the seat being vacated by retiring Democratic Rep. Frank E. Evans.

Two state representatives battled to out-conservative each other and win the Republican nomination to succeed Armstrong in the 5th District. The most ardent one, Ken Kramer, won at the conclusion of a bitter campaign against Bob Eckelberry. Both candidates claimed their voting records had been distorted by the other, and a representative from the Republican National Committee was sent into cool both sides down.
