Dear Ms. Ivell:

The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated August 7, 2018, but was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe Julio Gonzalez for Congress and Eric Robinson in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b)(3) and 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.3(a) and (d). In addition, the Commission was equally divided on whether to dismiss the allegation that Julio Gonzalez for Congress and Eric Robinson in his official capacity as treasurer and Julio Gonzalez violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f). The Commission was also equally divided on whether to dismiss the allegation that Winston Arabitg violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(a)(1)(A). Accordingly, on June 20, 2019, the Commission closed the file in this matter. One or more Statements of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision may follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
