Dear Mr. Bayes:

On August 9, 2018, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, Julio Gonzalez for Congress and Eric Robinson in his official capacity as treasurer and Julio Gonzalez, of a complaint alleging that they had violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

On June 20, 2019, the Commission considered the complaint but was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe Julio Gonzalez for Congress and Eric Robinson in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b)(3) and 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.3(a) and (d). In addition, the Commission was equally divided on whether to dismiss the allegation that Julio Gonzalez for Congress and Eric Robinson in his official capacity as treasurer and Julio Gonzalez violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f). Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). One or more Statements of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision may follow.
