Dear Mr. Slagle and Ms. Mains:

On May 4, 2022, your client, Ohio Works, was notified that the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission") found reason to believe that Unknown Respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30122 of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act") and that information obtained during the investigation of this matter indicated that Ohio Works may be one of the Unknown Respondents as to which the Commission made findings. The Complaint and the Commission's Factual and Legal Analysis were provided at that time. After considering the circumstances of the matter, the Commission voted on June 1, 2023, to substitute the name Ohio Works in place of "Unknown Respondents" in the Commission's previous findings that Unknown Respondents violated 52 U.S.C. § 30122 and closed the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision is not required in this matter in connection with your client, but if one is issued, it will be provided to you.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
