On June 10, 2021, your client, Raymond McVeigh, was notified that the Federal Election Commission (the "Commission") found reason to believe that he violated 52 U.S.C. § 30122 of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). After considering the circumstances of the matter, the Commission voted on June 1, 2023, to find no probable cause to believe that your client violated 52 U.S.C. § 30122, and closed the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision is not required in this matter in connection with your client, but if one is issued, it will be provided to you.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
