This is in reference to a complaint you filed with the Federal Election Commission on October 9, 2018, concerning allegations that Lancaster Stands Up and Common Defense (fka Common Defense/Beyond the Choir Action Fund) violated provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. On December 15, 2022, the Commission voted to dismiss this matter and closed the file. A Statement of Reasons further explaining the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters*, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8).
