Dear Ms. Nesburg:

The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations in your complaint received on September 14, 2018, but there was an insufficient number of votes to find reason to believe that New Republican PAC and Gentry Collins in his official capacity as treasurer, Rick Scott for Florida and Salvatore Purpura in his official capacity as treasurer, and Rick Scott violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter on June 10, 2021.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters*, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8).
