Dear Mr. Werbrock:

On October 3, 2018, the Federal Election Commission ("Commission") notified your clients of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). On May 21, 2019, the Commission considered the allegations in the complaint, but there was an insufficient number of votes to exercise its prosecutorial discretion to dismiss the allegations as to End Citizens United and Kimberly Coleman in her official capacity as treasurer. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.
